OS-20-05-04 ALL	<p><u>ACUPUNCTURE REGULATIONS</u></p> <p>Board Action: To decide if subsection 4702.7 of the acupuncture regulations should be amended as suggested for the practice of acupuncture by physicians.</p> <p>Background: The Board previously approved regulations for acupuncture, which added several updates to the profession including modifying the licensure requirements for physician applicants to include the requirement they obtain certification with the American Association of Medical Acupuncturists (AAMA). Staff has received feedback that this requirement is too excessive and unrealistic for any new applicants, as AAMA certification requires practicum hours, which some advocates argued can only be obtained after licensure. Dr. William Elliott was present to express the concern of the stakeholder community, which was that board certification cannot be obtained until after several years of practice of acupuncture. The Board asked legal to draft proposed language and bring back to the Board at the next meeting for review and approval.</p> <p>That language has been drafted and reviewed with Dr. Elliott. Below is the original language, as well as the proposed language:</p> <p>Original Language:</p> <p><i>A physician licensed in good standing in the District of Columbia may receive a license for acupuncture if he or she is certified in medical acupuncture by the American Board of Medical Acupuncture.</i></p> <p>Proposed Language:</p> <p><i>A physician licensed in good standing in the District of Columbia may receive a license for acupuncture if he or she has completed three hundred (300) hours of training in acupuncture from programs approved by the American Board of Medical Acupuncture. At least one hundred (100) hours must be in clinical training.</i></p>	SF
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<p>OS-20-05-05 ALL</p>	<p><u>PROPOSED ATHLETIC TRAINER REGULATIONS</u></p> <p>Board Action: To review comments from the DC Athletic Trainers Association (DCATA) on the proposed regulations implementing the licensure and regulation of Athletic Trainers by the DC Board of Medicine.</p> <p>Background: On February 6, 2019, the Mayor signed the Athletic Trainers Clarification Amendment Act of 2018, which authorized the Board of Medicine to regulate the practice of athletic trainers in the District. The first Notice of Proposed Regulations was published on February 21, 2020. A meeting was held with representatives from the DCATA, attorney Ajay Gohil and ED Frank Meyers on April 20, 2020 and most comments were resolved. However one comment remains outstanding regarding the Athletic Trainer scope of practice.</p>	
<p>OS-20-05-06 ALL</p>	<p><u>APPROVAL OF NON-ACGME FELLOWSHIPS – CNMC</u></p> <p>Board Action: To review the request for approval/renewal of several non-ACGME fellowships at Children’s National Medical CENTER.</p> <p>Background: Pursuant to 17 DCMR § 4611.2(c), applicants for an MTL II license must be participating in an ACGME, AOA or Board approved postgraduate clinical training fellowship program. CNMC has submitted three (3) programs for approval:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Cardiac Critical Care Medicine Fellowship 2. Cardiac Critical Care Telemedicine Fellowship 3. Pediatric Cardiac Electrophysiology Fellowship <p>As these programs are not ACGME accredited, they are requesting Board approval.</p>	

OS-20-05-07 ALL	<p><u>CHARACTER REFERENCE LETTERS</u></p> <p>Board Action: To review the requirements for character reference letters to determine modifications should be made.</p> <p>Background: DC Health’s IT staff are continuing their development of a new online licensure system for all health boards in HRLA. As part of the development, the Board of Medicine has been asked whether the character reference letters are still required, as it is the only board currently asking for such references.</p> <p>Pursuant to 17 DCMR § 4600.6, applicants for a medical license must submit three (3) character reference letters. There are similar requirements for nearly all professions regulated by the Board. The Associate Director has requested boards review this requirement to determine if it is necessary, as no other board has such a requirement.</p>	FM
