FYI-OS-1220-01	<p><u>LICENSURE WAIVER</u></p> <p><u>Background:</u> Beginning September 22, 2021, health care practitioners licensed in good standing in other states (who are vaccinated against COVID-19 unless granted a medical or religious exemption by the Department of Health) will be able to practice in DC without a license at a health care facility or via telepractice to an existing client/patient for continuing care until March 31, 2022, and DC Health cannot require these health care practitioners to apply for licensure, registration, or certification until March 31, 2022. The licensure waiver will continue until August 10, 2022.</p>	
FYI-OS-1220-02	<p>TEMPORARY WAVIER OF LICENSURE REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTAIN HEALTHCARE PROVIDERS</p> <p><u>Background:</u> Until October 31, 2021, an individual may engage in the unlicensed practice of providing healthcare to District residents for a particular health occupation if the individual:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) Is licensed in good standing in another jurisdiction in the applicable healthcare occupation. (b) Has not been issued a suspension or revocation order by a District of Columbia health occupation board; (c) Files an application with the Department of Health by October 1, 2021, or ten (10) calendar days after the individual first engages in the unlicensed practice of providing healthcare to District residents pursuant to this section, whichever is later, for a health occupation license that would allow the individual to 	

	<p>continue to provide healthcare services in their health occupation after October 31, 2021; and</p> <p>(d) Provides healthcare services pursuant to this section only:</p> <p>(1) At a licensed or certified healthcare entity listed in subsection 4020.2 of this section, which may include the provision of healthcare services by telehealth; or</p> <p>(2) To an established patient who has returned to the District of Columbia, and the individual is providing continuity of care to the patient by telehealth in accordance with applicable laws and regulations.</p>	
FYI-OS-1220-03	<p>NBCOT IMPOSTER SCAM ADVISORY</p> <p><u>Background:</u></p> <p>On October 21, 2021, NBCOT sent an advisory opinion in regards to an imposter scam that has impacted several different professions in Arkansas.</p> <p>The Office of the Attorney General recently became aware of a telephone scam targeting Arkansans who hold a professional license issued by the state. The caller poses as an agent for the licensing office and claims that the licensee is under an investigation and that their license has been suspended. The licensee's caller ID may even display the licensing office's phone number. To further attempt to appear legitimate, the caller may pretend to be a law enforcement officer or transfer the call to another person posing as a law enforcement officer or federal agent. The caller then offers to fix the problem or issue a temporary license and asks for personally identifiable information and a payment for a bond, e.g., \$5,000. The caller likely will require that the payment be made by purchasing gift cards at a local retail store. The caller may direct the licensee to travel to a UPS store or other such location to receive purported official documents, e.g., a letter of the licensee's suspension, and to fax copies of the gift cards as payment. Of course, once the scammers have the gift card numbers, they immediately cash out the cards, and are never heard from again. There have been several recent instances of this</p>	

	scam in Arkansas. We are also aware that this activity is occurring in other states.	
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
