**OS-0218-04 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT:**

**Mrs. Ericka Walker**, Executive Director of the Board, started her report by welcoming Board members, Board staff and all attendees to the meeting. She informed everyone that Ms. Aisha Nixon Will be presenting to the Board on the different compacts at DC Health and how they operate. Mrs. Walker then went over the Board Meeting calendar, pointing out that the upcoming Board meeting on March 18, 2026 will be in person. Anyone from the public can attend in person or join virtually. Next, she read the current Board census for the record, and advised that we do currently have 1 vacancy on the Board for a Consumer Member. Mrs. Walker briefly touched on requirements for the position and informed attendees that they can visit the MOTA website for more information if they are interested in applying.

Ms. Aisha Nixon started by thanking the Board members for their service before speaking about the compacts. She informed that there are currently 4 compacts that the District of Columbia Boards currently participate in: the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact, the Physical Therapy Compact, the Psychology Compact (PsyPact), and the Professional Counseling Compact. Ms. Nixon discussed the components of each compact, similarities and differences, different ways they affect the licensees, and reasons other Boards decided to participate in the compacts. She went through the process of implementation, the build out of the bylaws, and the platforms needed for it to be successful. Ms. Nixon stated that compacts do not increase the number of professionals in the field, but it does make it easier for those professionals to move around between jurisdictions. She also discussed budgetary concerns that are taken into consideration.

This ended Ms. Nixon's report.

Mrs. Walker advised that the Board would receive some additional finalized information for them to review in the March 2026 meeting so they can decide on if the District needs a compact, and if so which one. This completed her report.

<p><b>OS-0218-06</b></p>	<p><b>BOARD CHAIRPERSON’S REPORT:</b></p> <p><b>Michelle Latortue, DDS</b>, Chairperson of the Board, addressed some topics that were discussed during the Oversight Hearing. She started with application approval times and stated that the times have improved for all license types. Dr. Latortue then spoke on the representation of Dental Hygienists and Dental Assistants on the Board. She informed that there are currently 5 dentists and 1 hygienist on the Board, but the Board is open to adjusting the composition. She also reminded the attendees that the Board is still trying to fill the consumer member position. Next Dr. Latortue advised that the Board permanently implemented the Incentivized Time Period Registration for Dental Assistants as it was an effective way to bring dental professionals into compliance. She also touched on the compacts and advised that the Board is carefully reviewing each one while obtaining additional info including workforce data and census figures. Dr. Latortue addressed the topic of the pathway for foreign trained dentists to practice dentistry, and informed the attendees that the Board is gathering additional information from other jurisdictions as to their pathway options.</p> <p>Mrs. Brittany Campbell sought clarification on the process of changing the composition</p>

of the Board. Ms. Williams advised that this not determined by the Board, and it would require a change to the HORA from the Mayor’s office. The Board can provide an opinion and recommendation, however the Mayor’s Office would ultimately make the decision.

Mrs. Walker reported that Councilmember Henderson holds hearings annually where she meets with various Board chairs to hear about some of the great work the Boards are doing and have the opportunity to ask questions. She also provided some reasons why some licensure times were higher than others (delayed supporting documentation from credentialing organizations, delayed submissions of required documentation by applicants, and some applicants were under investigation for unlicensed practice). Lastly Mrs. Walker advised that any changes to the composition of the Board will come from leadership versus the Board itself.

Dr. Latortue added that the Board is in full compliance with the District’s Open Meeting Act by providing a standing agenda item at every public meeting for the public to provide their feedback, concerns and opinions. Lastly, she expressed that the Board does not support eliminating Dental Assistant Level I registration and that you can obtain this registration with a High School Diploma or GED.

**DISCUSSION ITEMS**

**OS-0218-08 LEGISLATIVE UPDATES – OFFICE OF GOVERNMENT RELATIONS**

**Mrs. Ericka Walker**, Executive Director of the Board, presented on behalf of Ms. Kera Johnson. She advised that the current updates are listed on the agenda below and spoke briefly on the Performance Oversight Hearings. Mrs. Walker restated the Board chair testified before the Committee on Health last week and informed that DC Health will be testifying on Friday February 20, 2026. Dr. Bennett, Director of DC Health, will speak on DC Health's performance for Fiscal Year 2025 and provide updates on Fiscal Year 2026. Lastly, Mrs. Walker encouraged the attendees to watch the hearing that was happening concurrently with the Board of Dentistry meeting where there were 75 public witnesses providing testimony on DC Health's Fiscal Year 2025 performance.

This concluded her report relating to the Legislative Updates.

**Performance Oversight**

- The Committee on Health will hold Performance Oversight hearings throughout the month of February. The hearings will consist of testimony from Board Chairs, the public as well as from Agency Directors.

**Lowering the Cost of Prescription Drugs Act of 2026**

- On February 2<sup>nd</sup>, Councilmember Christina Henderson introduced the *Lowering the Cost of Prescription Drugs Act of 2026* ([B26-0593](#)).
  - The legislation allows DC Health, on behalf of the Mayor, to enter into a cooperative purchasing agreement with a prescription drug discount program (ArrayRX) for the explicit purpose of lowering the cost of prescription medications for all District residents, regardless of insurance status.
- The bill has been referred to the Committee on Health, but no hearing has been scheduled yet.

**Streamlining Medicaid Credentialing Amendment Act of 2025**

- On December 1<sup>st</sup>, Councilmember Christina Henderson introduced the *Streamlining Medicaid Credentialing Amendment Act of 2025* ([B26-0523](#)).
  - The legislation creates a centralized and standardized credentialing system for Medicaid providers in the District, easing the burden on qualified healthcare providers, and allowing them to deliver care to patients and be compensated for care more quickly.
- The bill has been referred to the Committee on Health, but no hearing has been scheduled yet.

**Community Health Amendment Act of 2025**

- Following emergency and temporary versions, Councilmember Henderson introduced the *Community Health Amendment Act of 2025* ([B26-0414](#)) on October 6<sup>th</sup>.
- This legislation received a [hearing](#) on October 30<sup>th</sup> in the Committee on Health. DC Health testified in support of the bill expressing the importance of vaccine availability and access. A mark-up was held on [December 8, 2025](#).

Ms. Williams advised that these were previewed at the December meeting to keep to the promise the subcommittee had made to have draft legislation ready by the end of the year. However, none of the Board saw the draft regulations prior to the December meeting as the agenda materials were sent out to the Board before they were ready. This is the meeting to ask for comments and feedback from the Board members. Board also always gives the public an opportunity to share comments as well.</p> <p>Ms. Williams started with going over the changes to the Dental Assistant Regulations.</p>

She discussed the process proposed for Dental Assistant Level I to take radiographs and clarified that it is an optional authority (like the option for Dental Hygienists to administer Local Anesthesia). She also reviewed the changes in the scope of practice for all Dental Assistant levels as well as clarified the definition and duties of dental assistant. The Board then discussed the scope of practice for “Dental Assistants” as opposed to “Sterilization Technicians”. The discussion was opened to the public and Dr. Evelyn Leach took this time to discuss the OSHA exposure plan as it relates to the duties of a sterilization technician.

Ms. Williams then advised that they used the implemented policy from the Board of Pharmacy as a guideline for the new regulations for Dental Hygienists to administer immunizations and vaccines. After reviewing the policy, Ms. Williams advised that the recommendation from the Regulatory Affairs committee is to request the Credentials and Audits committee use these recommendations and develop the educational requirements needed to implement this policy. The Credentials and Audits committee would also look into what the coursework should look like and provide that information back to the Board so it can be incorporated into the regulations.

**Motion:** The Board moved to have the Credentials and Audits Committee take the recommendations for vaccinations and develop the education requirements needed to implement. The Board also moved to have the Credentials and Audits Committee look into what the coursework should look like and provide feedback to the Board so it can be incorporated into the regulations.

Lastly, Dr. Lewis and Ms. Williams informed that the subcommittee reviewed Collaborative Practice Agreements from other states and decided to use one from Massachusetts as a starting point. Ms. Williams stated it is similar to what the Boards of Medicine and Pharmacy currently have in place. She then went over all the components of the framework of the agreement. Mrs. Brittany Campbell helped to clarify the reasoning for this Agreement is to better utilize dental hygienists as a resource in public health settings and provide preventative and restorative care to populations who lack regular access to it. Dr. Bradshaw inquired who would carry the burden of a malpractice complaint in settings like this. Ms. Williams and Mrs. Campbell advised that this is something that would be addressed in the agreement between the Dental Hygienist and the Dentist. The Board members will review and provide feedback at the next meeting.

**OS-0218-10 DC DENTAL SOCIETY LETTER TO THE BOARD OF DENTISTRY**

The Board provided Mr. Gallagher time to expand on the letter the Board received from the DC Dental Society. He opined on how Sterilization Technicians are an important role aside from being a Dental Assistant, and how employees in this position can help keep the flow of a dental practice moving smoothly. He also spoke on the challenges of Dental Assistant Level III and that it could be broken down and added into the scope of practice for a Dental Assistant Level II with appropriate certification. He also opined that the Dental Assistant Level process is expensive and some of the requirements are

	<p>redundant.</p> <p>Dr. Lucciola Lambruschini also chimed in to agree with Mr. Gallagher, stating she has been told by Dental Assistant Level IIs that they would like to advance to the next step but it is very expensive.</p> <p>Dr. Jonelle Anamelechi inquired whether it is possible to survey the public and determine the underlying reason for lack of Dental Assistant Level IIIs. She also asked whether accepting the opinion that the requirements are too much and therefore should be reduced to obtain more registrants is protective of the public.</p> <p>Ms. Williams reminded the attendees that the Dental Assistant Level III position was created at the request of the public to perform 3 specific items. She also advised that Level III is now in the HORA so to change it would mean having to repeal the HORA, not simply removing it from the regulations. Ms. Williams reminded the attendees that there is currently 1 program that trains Dental Assistant Level IIIs in the District and that program testified during a previous Open Session Board Meeting that they were not putting people in the Level III course due to their concerns at the time about DANB. She inquired what is the real reason as there has been mentions about the costs and about the education requirement.</p> <p>Mrs. Brittany Campbell echoed what Ms. Williams stated and requested that prior to making changes to this that the Board look at all the issues that could contribute to the lack of Level IIIs.</p> <p>Dr. Latortue suggested that the Board look into more programs to provide Level III assistant training as a way for more individuals to receive the necessary training.</p> <p>Lastly Mr. Gallagher suggested maybe the Board review the verbiage in the regulations to change the redundancy in the requirements for Level III.</p> <p><b>Motion:</b> The Board moved to have the Credentials and Audits Committee look into the language around the requirements for Dental Assistant Level III.  <b>Moved by:</b> Dr. Jonelle Anamelechi (Board Member)  <b>Seconded by:</b> Dr. Chanelle Roberts (Board Member)  <b>Votes: Ay</b> – Dr. Chanelle Roberts, Dr. Imani Lewis, Dr. Eric Bradshaw, Dr. Michelle Latortue; <b>Nay</b> – Mrs. Brittany Campbell; <b>No Vote</b> – Dr. Jonelle Anamelechi (call dropped). <b>Motion passed.</b></p>
