

To assess and promote oral health across the District of Columbia with emphasis on access to comprehensive oral health services for all residents through a dental home



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#### **Strategic Objectives**


Objective	Population	Baseline	Base Year	<u>2026</u> Target
Reduce the use of the Emergency Department for preventable dental emergencies (/100,000 residents)	Overall	834	2019-2020	666
Increase the percent of adults who visited the dentist or dental clinic within the past 12 months	18 years and older	74%	2018	78%
	Black adults 18 years and older	65%	2018	71%
