

## NOTICE OF SUMMARY ACTION TO SUSPEND LICENSE

To: Keri M. Bentley, M.D. 10616 Eagles Dr. Knoxville, TN 37922

In accordance with the provisions of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, D.C. Code § 2–509; the District of Columbia Health Occupations Revision Act of 1985, D.C. Code § 3–1205.15(a); and 17 DCMR § 4118, the District of Columbia Department of Health (D.C. Health) gives you notice of the summary suspension of your medical license, MD047965, under D.C. Code § 3–1205.15(a).

Your license is summarily suspended effective immediately upon receipt of this notice. If you wish to appeal this summary suspension of your license, you must file a request for a hearing within 72 hours after service of this notice. Should you request a hearing, one will be held within 72 hours of a timely request, and a decision will be rendered within 72 hours after the close of the hearing. The request for a hearing must be submitted in writing to Suzanne Fenzel, Assistant General Counsel, D.C. Health. The request may be submitted by email to suzanne.fenzel3@dc.gov or by mail to 899 North Capital Street, N.E., 6th Floor, Washington, D.C. 20002. Ms. Fenzel can be reached at (202) 724-8915.

The District of Columbia (the District) is represented by the Office of the Attorney General for the District of Columbia. A copy of your hearing request and any pleading or other written communication addressed to D.C. Health must also be delivered to Kevin Lutes, Assistant Attorney General (AAG), Office of the Attorney General for the District of Columbia, Civil Enforcement Section, 400 Sixth Street, N.W., Suite 10100, Washington, D.C. 20001. AAG Lutes can be reached at (202) 807-0380 or by email at kevin.lutes@dc.gov.

You may appear personally at the hearing, and you may be represented by legal counsel. You have the right to produce witnesses and evidence, to cross-examine witnesses against you, to examine evidence produced, and to have subpoenas issued to require the production of witnesses and evidence.

All hearings are conducted in the English language. If you or any witnesses to be called are deaf, have a hearing impediment, or cannot readily understand or communicate the spoken English language, an application may be made to the Administrative Law Judge for the appointment of a qualified interpreter.

A request for a hearing will not stay the suspension of your license.

The charge upon which the summary suspension is based is set forth below.

Charge:

Your medical license was suspended by the States of Kentucky, Alabama, Wyoming, Iowa, and Tennessee and has not been reinstated, for which D.C. Health can take summary action to suspend your District medical license under D.C. Code § 3–1205.15(a)(1)(A).

On March 24, 2023, the Kentucky Board of Medical Licensure (Kentucky Board) summarily suspended your license to practice medicine under Ky. Rev. Stat. Ann. § 13B.125(2). The Kentucky Board found you "[e]ngaged in dishonorable, unethical, or unprofessional conduct of a character likely to deceive, defraud, or harm the public or any member thereof..." under Ky. Rev. Stat. Ann. § 311.595(9).

On March 24, 2023, the States of Alabama and Wyoming summarily suspended your license. On April 6, 2023, the State of Iowa summarily suspended your license. On April 26, 2023, the State of Tennessee summarily suspended your license. To date, your Kentucky, Alabama, Wyoming, Iowa, and Tennessee licenses remain suspended.

Please note under 17 DCMR § 4103.2, your failure to appear at the time and place set for the hearing, either in person or through counsel, or both, will not preclude D.C. Health's proceeding in this matter.
