## <u>COVID-19</u>

In response to the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, DC Health remains operational. We continue to provide essential services; however, there are changes to how some services are provided. The Health Regulation and Licensing Administration (HRLA) Processing Center will be open to the public by appointment only on Mondays and Wednesdays from 9:00 AM to 1:00 PM. The online appointment scheduler is <u>appts.dcvsims.com</u>.

The District of Columbia recently launched the free DC COVID Alert Notice (DC CAN) to help provide quick notification of potentially exposure so you can reduce the risk of infection and help stop the spread.

## LICENSURE/REGISTRATION INFORMATION:

- Renewals are now live. Licenses are set to expire on January 31, 2021.
- Licensees that don't renew by January 31, 2021 will have a sixty (60) day grace period to do so with an additional late fee of \$85.
- The Board of Physical Therapy regulates the following two (2) professional groups:
  - Physical Therapists
  - Physical Therapist Assistants
- As graduates (an individual no longer in a student/intern/practicum status) are preparing to enter the workforce, physical therapists must remember that <u>a physical</u> <u>therapist or physical therapist assistant license is required before an individual can</u> <u>provide services</u>.
- How to obtain Supervised Practice Approval: A request for Supervised Practice Form must be submitted to the Board and approve before any provision of physical therapy services can begin. Supervised practice is a Board approved status which allows an individual with a complete\* licensure application and negative criminal background check (CBC) results the opportunity to work, while the application is in the processing phase.

\*A complete application means, all required forms and documents have been received, meet the requirements, and there is no positive criminal background result.



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- A filed application is not a license and does not authorize the provision of services.

- If your information (name, mailing address, email address, phone number, etc.) has changed since your last renewal, please send your new contact information to <u>dcbopt@dc.gov</u>. For name changes, please include copy of name change documents (marriage certificate, divorce decree, etc.).

## **UPDATED CONTINUING EDUCATION INFORMATION:**

- An application for renewal of a license expiring on January 31, 2021, shall complete, forty (40) continuing education units (CEUs) for Physical Therapist, and thirty (30) continuing education units for Physical Therapist Assistants.
- Two (2) hours of CEUs of the forty (40) or thirty (30) CEUs are required in cultural competence and appropriate clinical treatment specifically for individuals who are lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, gender nonconforming, queer, or questioning their sexual orientation or gender identity and expression.
- All licensed health care providers in the District of Columbia are now required to complete 10% or four (4) or three (3) CEUs of the required total of continuing education in the public health priorities of the District as determined by the Director and published every five (5) years or less frequently as deemed appropriate. - Proof of successful completion shall be submitted within thirty (30) days after it is requested by the Board.
- The LGBTQ and the public health priorities CEUs are also required for a reactivation and reinstatement application.
