#### COVID-19

In response to the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, DC Health remains operational. We continue to provide essential services; however, there are changes to how some services are provided. #### LICENSURE/REGISTRATION INFORMATION:

- The Board of Social Work regulates the following four (4) professional groups
  - Licensed Social Work Associate (LSWA)
  - Licensed Graduate Social Worker (LGSW)
  - Licensed Independent Social Worker (LISW)
  - Licensed Independent Clinical Social Worker (LICSW)
- As graduates (an individual no longer in a student/intern/practicum status) are preparing to enter the workforce, remember <u>a social work license is required before</u> <u>becoming employed, providing services, and accumulating post-graduate supervision</u> <u>hours</u>. Before engaging in any social work practice, you should hold a bachelor-level (SWA) or master-level (LGSW) license. If you have any question, please contact the Board's Health Licensing Specialist at 202-442-4782.
- A filed application is not a license and does not authorize the provision of services.
- Verify a license by visiting <u>doh.force.com/ver/s</u>.
- Supervision of an unlicensed individual subjects a licensed LISW and/or LICSW to disciplinary action. Supervisors, please be advised that <u>supervisees must have the</u> <u>appropriate license prior to receiving supervision hours and providing services</u>. If you are providing supervision to another professional group such as Professional Counselor, please ensure that you have reviewed their regulations and they have the required license prior to providing supervision.

  - The Board defines private practice as one that operates from a business/organizational structure such as a solo practice/business, group practice (which maybe a LLC, PLLC, or a partnership); or a corporation.

### **UPDATED CONTINUING EDUCATION INFORMATION:**

- An application for renewal of a license expiring on July 31, 2021 shall complete, forty (40) continuing education units (CEUs).
- Six (6) of the forty (40) CEUs must be in ethics.
- Two (2) hours of CEUs of the 40 CEUs are required in cultural competence and appropriate clinical treatment specifically for individuals who are lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, gender non-conforming, queer, or questioning their sexual orientation or gender identity and expression. Please note that these CEUs are separate from the Health Priorities requirement.
- All licensed health care providers in the District of Columbia are now required to complete 10% or four (4) CEUs of the required total of continuing education in the public health priorities of the District as determined by the Director and published every five (5) years or less frequently as deemed appropriate. Please follow the link and refer to the identified subject areas for the public health considerations:
