	Notice Regarding Practice by Veterinary Student
	According to D.C. Official Code §3-1201.03(c) and 17 DCMR § 2818, veterinary students are authorized to practice veterinary medicine under specific conditions:
	 The practice must be part of the student's course of instruction. It must be supervised by a licensed veterinarian in the District of Columbia or a qualified teacher of veterinary medicine approved by the District of Columbia Board of Veterinary Medicine. The practice should occur at an appropriate veterinary facility (e.g., operated by the District of Columbia, federal government, or
	another approved facility). 4. Procedures must adhere to guidelines established by the Board.



Reciprocity Agreement

District of Columbia, Maryland and Virginia have entered into an agreement to establish reciprocity amongst the parties to facilitate the expedited licensure of health professionals practicing within the three jurisdictions. The agreement is not yet fully signed by VA and MD.

ANIMAL SERVICES PROGRAM REPORT (ASP)

ONLINE DOG LICENSING APPLICATIONS

DC Health, Health Regulation and Licensing Administration (HRLA) is excited to announce the opening of our new online dog licensing system. All dog owners in the District are required to submit their dog registration or renewal applications by going to the below link and submitting an online application.

Action plan for dog licensing through partnership with veterinary facilities:

- **Objective:** Use the influence and reach of veterinary facilities to educate dog owners about the importance of licensing their pets.

- Action Items:

- Provide veterinary facilities with dog license manuals that highlight the benefits of licensing.
- Ensure these manuals contain a QR code that directly links to the dog licensing portal, simplifying the application process.



Ms. Joy McFarlane Mills stated that Animal Services staff has been working with IT to fix some issues in the portal before we can move forward with this partnership project. She also stated that arbovirus program is in its third week now and investigator, Mr. Eric Curry is on the field while our new investigator Ms. Lakethia McCoy has been shadowing him. Dr. Sarah Sirica reported about the songbird illness. In May through July 2021, a newly emerging illness affected mainly fledgling birds in eastern states, including Virginia, Maryland, Delaware, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, West Virginia, Kentucky, Ohio, Indiana, and the District of Columbia. The symptoms included crusty eyes, tremors, and paralysis among songbirds. However, no cause has been definitively determined. - NLP algorithms can analyze veterinary literature, case reports, and clinical notes to extract relevant information.
- Veterinarians can benefit from Al-generated summaries and recommendations.

iii. Diagnostics and Imaging:

Al algorithms can analyze medical images (such as X-rays, MRIs, and ultrasounds) to assist veterinarians in diagnosing conditions like fractures, tumors, or organ abnormalities.

iv. Predictive Analytics:

- Al models can predict disease outbreaks, track disease trends, and assess risk factors in animal populations for example, predicting the spread of infectious diseases or identifying at-risk animals for preventive measures.

v. Treatment Planning:

- All can recommend personalized treatment plans based on an individual animal's health history, genetics, and response to previous treatments.
- It can also suggest optimal drug dosages and monitor treatment effectiveness.

vi. Health Monitoring:

- Wearable devices and sensors equipped with AI can continuously monitor vital signs, detect anomalies, and alert veterinarians to potential health issues.
- This real-time monitoring enhances early disease detection and intervention.

vii. Research and Drug Discovery:

AAVSB Veterinary Team Survey

The American Association of Veterinary State Boards (AAVSB) released its conclusions of its 2023 survey which reached veterinarians and veterinary technicians across North America. The survey was focused on exploring the potential delegation of tasks within veterinary teams as well as the potential introduction of a midlevel veterinary practitioner under a valid VCPR.

LEGISLATIVE/REGULATIONS PDMP

Mr. Matteo Lieb provided the following legal updates:

Health Occupations Revision Act (HORA) Update:

- DC Health worked on a significant revision of the HORA. This would be the first significant revision in seventeen years.
- The revised HORA received Mayoral approval and has been introduced in the Council as the Health Occupations Revision General Amendment Act of 2023 (B25-0545).
- This legislation received a hearing on <u>December 7th</u>. Over 80 witnesses, many of whom were healthcare professionals, signed up to provide testimony. DC Health's Associate Director of Health Professional Licensing Boards provided testimony in support and answered questions from the Council.
- DC Health has been working on the Committee on Health following that hearing. A mark-up was held on March 21st, 2024. The legislation was passed unanimously by the Committee of the Whole on First Reading on April 2nd and on Second Reading on May 7th. The legislation was signed by the Mayor on May 29th and will now go through Congressional Review. OGR anticipates this will become law by either early August or early September.

DC Health Fiscal Year 2025 Budget Oversight

- DC Health will have its Fiscal Year 2025 Budget Oversight hearing in early April. This hearing offers an opportunity for the Committee on Health to review DC Health's proposed budget for the 2025 Fiscal Year.

- There were two hearings, one on <u>April 10th</u> for public witnesses and one on <u>April 11th</u> for representatives from DC Health. During the hearing, there was discussion around staffing for health professional licensing boards and investments to address healthcare workforce issues.
- The mark-up for DC Health's budget in the Committee on Health was held on May 9th. The marked-up FY25 budget was advanced unanimously out of Committee. It then went to the Committee of the Whole where it was passed on First Reading with 11 votes. The next legislative meeting is on June 11th.





Council Recess:

- The District of Columbia Council will be on recess starting on July 15th through September 15th.
- During that time, limited activity can take place by the Council.

Pets in Housing Amendment Act of 2024:

- On May 22nd, Councilmember R. White along with Councilmembers Bonds, Pinto, T. White, and Lewis George introduced the *Pets in Housing Amendment Act of 2024* (B25-0827).
 - This legislation limits fees by housing providers (monthly rent and security deposits) for pets as well as banning breed restrictions.
- This legislation has been referred to the Committee on Housing, but not hearing has been scheduled.

The new Veterinary Technician and Euthanasia Technicians regulations became effective Friday, August 6, 2021. At this time, the DC Department of Health will not be issuing registrations until the process is in place.

The Department of Health is currently creating the platform by which individuals can submit an application for registration as either a Veterinary Technician or a Veterinary Euthanasia Technician. Once the platform is available, there will be a grace period for which individuals will need to come into full compliance.
