ITEM	DISCUSSION
Call to Order	Derrick C. called the meeting to order at 5:08 pm, followed by a moment of silence and introductions.
Review and Adoption of the Agenda	Haris Y. motioned to adopt the agenda for November 12, 2020. Antonio W. seconded. The agenda was adopted unanimously.
Review and Approval of the Minutes	Antonio motioned to approve the October 15, 2020 Meeting Minutes. Haris seconded. The minutes were approved unanimously.
CLS Planning/Update	<p>Sharon C. reminded the committee that it was agreed at last month's meeting to push the Community Listening Session (CLS) back to February to give the committee members time to look into their personal networks and suggest the names of five (5) contacts to enlist for participation. Sharon found Dr. Mall, an I.D. doctor working out of Greenbelt with more than 20 years of experience and connected to Doctor's Hospital. Another reference is Dr. Patrick Hall, who had a practice in Clinton Maryland but is now associated with Southern Hospital. Neither doctor holds support groups, and their pool of people may not have had exposure to such groups or town halls. Sharon also suggested looking into social groups like the National Coalition of 100 Black Women whose representative informed Sharon of their health ministry that works with young ladies. The committee will send all information including contact name, phone number and email address to Lamont to start formulating a list and post in Basecamp.</p> <p>Antonio suggested reaching parents via high school meetings, if permitted by the principals, and reaching out to senior citizens via organizations that provide services to them. Antonio asked about the shelters SLK had visited and suggested them for engagement. He further indicated that if the technology was not available for them to participate via zoom, he could supply what was needed.</p> <p>Philip S. suggested Michael Vera of AHF on Benning Road and he will try to contact someone at Unity Health Clinic. He will also speak with his fraternity chapter.</p> <p>Krista H. contacted Leah at the Towers. Leah is in marketing and disseminates information. She will also contact fraternity and sorority partners at the University of Maryland whom she provides flu clinics with.</p> <p>Ken P. spoke with Dr. Olberg at Kaiser. Dr. Olberg is extremely interested and will disseminate any information given to him from the committee to his colleagues. Ken also suggested contacting a colleague he met during one of their outdoor sessions named Kevin who does a lot of advocacy work. Derrick is acquainted with him and will follow up with him on Instagram.</p> <p>There was discussion about how to be more creative at inviting participation in and announcing/advertising for the CLS'. Philip had suggested a short</p>



	<p>video, 60–90 seconds long to include information about CEEC, the conversations to be embarked upon and when the CLS' are scheduled. The information and topics discussed at the CLS should relate to Ending the Epidemic and what 's going to get us across the finish line.</p> <p>The committee is to bring suggestions to the next meeting on how to segue into the CLS conversations. Everyone should have something ready to present at the next meeting and the committee will decide on the topic for that day. Lists of references for engagement should be sent to Lamont by close of business on Monday or no later than Friday.</p> <p>Derrick offered to contact the videographers he is acquainted with to have the infomercial done at no charge. The infomercial should be available by January.</p>		
CEEC 2020 Workplan Update	<p>There was discussion about the time spent planning the Engagement/Community Listening Sessions of the Work Plan. It was decided to shift the focus while planning for the next CLS in February. The action item Engagement/Activities/Attend a minimum of 6 community events as CEEC members, is something that has been taking place. Therefore, Lamont suggested that the committee document what meetings they are attending to see where people are engaging and see what type of reach CEEC is having. Have a list available by the next meeting.</p>		
Announcements and Adjournment	<p>Sharon announced that SLK is having their first “Tests for Turkeys” tomorrow at the First United Methodist Church in Hyattsville from 10am - 2 pm and another on November 21st at the Mission of Love in Capital Heights. Safeway donated 200 turkeys for this event.</p> <p>Derrick announced that the Mayor’s Office of LGBTQ Affairs is having an event for World AIDS Day December 1st . Derrick will post the event in Basecamp.</p> <p>Ken announced that there is a jurisdictional attempt at Ending the Epidemic, and HAHSTA is putting together a PSA to talk about how we can think about a regional narrative around it. The PSA should launch on December 1st . Also, there will be a tour of significant places through the history around Ending the Epidemic.</p>
