## AGENDA

ITEM	DISCUSSION
<b>Call to Order</b>	Sharon C. called the meeting to order at 5:10 pm, followed by a moment of silence and introductions.
<b>Review and Adoption of the Agenda</b>	Jenné M. motioned to adopt the agenda for January 21, 2021. Derrick C. seconded. The agenda was adopted unanimously.
<b>Review and Approval of the Minutes</b>	Derrick motioned to approve the November 12, 2020 Meeting Minutes. Krista H. seconded. The minutes were approved unanimously.
<b>CLS Planning/Update</b>	<p>Sharon C. indicated that the Community Listening Session (CLS) was pushed back to February to give the committee members time to look into their personal networks with the intention of reaching a different and broader demographic (doctors, leaders of boys and girls clubs, etc.). The sessions will last 30 – 45 minutes and offer break out groups to be scheduled for a later date for people who may be interested participating. Each committee member was to submit at least three (3) names to begin a list of invitees. Send all names and contact information to Lamont. Although the initial idea for the CLS was to have an open meeting in Maryland, it was decided that under the current state of affairs, using the zoom platform allows for the session to include prevention and CARE and open to all residents of the EMA with no cap on attendance.</p> <p>The following tasks need to be completed in organizing the event.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Derrick and Philip S. are working together on a 60–90 second infomercial that will introduce and give a description of COHAH, and CEEC, conversations to be embarked upon, and a schedule of CEEC activities. Parts of the PowerPoint Kaleef created will be used. Derrick is requesting each member to send him a head shot with their name and title to be included at the end of the infomercial. He will contact the videographer and give the committee an update of the status. And he will use Sheila Reed to help with promotions and advertisements.</li> <li>Ken P. will provide incentives for participating in the CLS via 4 raffles at \$25 each.</li> <li>The CLS will be scheduled for late February/early March depending on when the infomercial is completed.</li> <li>Lamont C. will create an Eventbrite once the date is confirmed and set up the zoom for the CLS with enabled polling for votes.</li> <li>Derrick and Sharon will facilitate the CLS along with Krista for pharmacy and COVID-19 questions and Sarcia A. for housing inquiries.</li> <li>Jenne will supervise the chat box and perform as notetaker.</li> </ul> <p>The post follow-up for the CLS is:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The recruitment of others into the CEEC</li> <li>Have those who don't care to join, to follow CEEC's movements and updates on available Ryan White services</li> </ul>

<b>CEEC 2020 Workplan Discussion</b>	The workplan from last year had changed because of the particular needs and barriers that arose as a result of the pandemic. However, there was discussion about consolidating some of the activities listed in the workplan and being intentional and focused on just a few things instead of adding more things. Under normal circumstances, a COHAH retreat would occur next month and that would be the time when the committees would work on their workplans. The retreat is cancelled; therefore, it is okay to resume working on the CEEC workplan after the CLS.		
<b>Announcements and Adjournment</b>	<p>COVID clinics are open on Tuesdays and Thursdays in DC.</p> <p>Jenné announced that GW is conducting one (1) hour long qualitative interviews with men, (black, gay, bi and msm), aged 15 -34 on their experiences with obtaining HIV services. There is a \$50 incentive for participating and a \$15 payment for referrals. GW is conducting another study that is not qualitative, is more in-depth, and collects medical information. More information on that study is forthcoming.</p> <p>Ken announced a year long DMV History Project that will walk down the road of the history of HIV, and the spaces and places that have supported and informed where we are now, showcasing the first home of Us Helping Us. The first meeting is scheduled for February 1, 2021. The first soft launch will be Feb 5<sup>th</sup>. at which time there will be an intergenerational conversation around healing in the black community and how healing supported the HIV community when there was only the one (1) drug, AZT, and how self-help groups helped a lot of people along the way. More information is coming. Ken is looking for information relating to events and places in Maryland. Ken will send the flyer of the actual program to Derrick who will post it in Basecamp and he will forward the save the date by Monday.</p>
