Call to Order	The meeting was called to order by Kaleef M. at 5:24pm. He asked for a moment of silence then asked everyone to introduce themselves for the record.		
Review and Approval of the Agenda	N/A		
Review and Approval of the Minutes	N/A		
EMA's Epidemiological Overview	Jenevieve Opoku, Behavioral Scientist from HAHSTA, gave a presentation on the Epidemiological/HIV Surveillance Data from the Washington DC EMA. She noted that the data gathered was based on 'residence at diagnoses.		
Service Utilization and Spending	Lena Lago, HAHSTA's Deputy Chief of Care and Treatment Division, gave a presentation on Client Service Utilization and Outcome Data. She noted that the data was specific to clients that were touched by the Ryan White program in the EMA.		
	Clover Barnes gave a presentation on the DC EMA Expenditure and Unit- Based Cost Data for 2017. She noted that Unit Based Cost data was only for a 5-month period and at next years' PSRA the Commission would have data for a full yar available which would then allow them to make better decisions.		
Priority Setting for the Washington, DC	Kaleef noted that everyone should have received a document that provides the definitions for all of the service categories.		
Eligible Metropolitan Area (EMA)	Lamont C. explained to the Commissioners how the Priority Setting voting process works. Commissioners were provided with voting sheets and upon completion of their votes, Lamont collected the forms for a final tally.		
Resource Allocation for the EMA	Kaleef reviewed a document that showed the PSRA results from the 2018 PSRA process from each jurisdictions' PSRA process as well as information regarding Epidemiology and resource allocation from the 2017 process.		
	<i>Virginia Linguistic Services Motion</i> He then noted that the first item of business was to address an issue from		



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Virginia. He explained that there is a category called Linguistics Services that was not funded in the last PSRA process, but money was reprogrammed into that category during the year and there has been utilization of that category during the year. In the 2018 PSRA meeting for Virginia, because of an oversight, money was not put into that category again, but the need is there, so a percentage should be put in the category. Jennifer Z. suggested putting 1% into the category and take that money from Other Professional Services. A motion was made to take 1% from Other Professional Services and put 1% into Linguistic Services. The motion passed by a vote of 22 - Yes, 0 - No. EMA Resource Allocation Kaleef provided a chart that showed last year resource allocations. The chart also provided suggested allocations based on last year's allocations and where the current utilization of money is currently. The bases of the suggested allocations was to move money back into the jurisdictions where the money would be able to cover support services and be better utilized to help clients. Clover noted that reprogramming takes a process to get money back into the jurisdictions. She stated that it would be a more proactive measure to put money into the categories where they are more likely to be spent than it is to do a broad allocation then scramble to reprogram it in the middle of the year. It was also noted that since many clients have insurance, and Ryan White is a payer or last resort, there are a number of categories that do not have a high percentage of spending since the providers are billing insurance first. If there is no other payer, then Ryan White will pay. Typically, insurance has paid for most Core Services, while Ryan White tends to pay for most Support Services. A motion was made to accept the suggested Resource Allocations. **The** motion passed by a vote of 23 – Yes, 0 – No. Kaleef noted that the body needed to approve the entire slate of Priority Setting and Resource Allocations for the EMA and Jurisdictions. A motion was made to accept the entire slate. The motion passed by a vote of 23 -Yes, 0 – No. Kaleef noted that there was some thoughts about how to take all of the work done by the Comprehensive Planning Committee (CPC) and present it to the Ryan White entire General Body without a duplication of efforts. Tim A. noted that there HIV/AIDS could be an 'Assent Calendar' that would basically say that the work in each Program committee was completed and motions were passed at that level, and the (RWHAP) – motions would be presented to the General Body as an entire slate verses Reports & rehashing the same work. He noted that questions could still be raised, but it Financial could be a more efficient process. Oversight Kaleef stated that tonite only the key points from the narratives would be
