AGENDA

ITEM	DISCUSSION
Call to Order	Jane W. called the meeting to order at 1:07 pm followed by a moment of silence and introductions.

<p>Review and Approval of the Agenda</p>	<p>Lamont C. noted that Christopher (Chauncey) Watson could not attend the meeting today. Therefore, it was suggested to remove the EHE Grant Discussion from the agenda. Jane assumed the motion to approve the September 25, 2024, Meeting Agenda with the necessary change.</p>
<p>Review and Approval of the Minutes</p>	<p>With no revisions noted on the August 28, 2024, Meeting Minutes, Jane assumed the motion to approve the minutes as presented.</p>
<p>Check-In</p>	<p>The committee gave their reflections on the recent US Conference on HIV/AIDS (USCHA). Highlighted insights about funding announcements, data presentations and the value of intergenerational conversations came from Melvin C., Kenneth P., Martha C., and Alan J.</p> <p>Melvin attended USCHA for the first time. The conference was different from the social work conferences he usually attends as the USCHA had more of a global perspective. Melvin attended a workshop on empowering Black women in leadership roles and making sure their voices and bodies are at the table, led by Clover Barnes. It was followed by a look at PrEP and the rollouts that are coming down the pike for women (injections, inserts and vaginal rings).</p> <p>Kenneth highlighted the inspirational aspects of USCHA compared to the Ryan White Conference. Ken indicated that a lot of data is given at the Ryan White Conference, but you receive the hope and inspiration to keep doing the work from the USCHA.</p> <p>Martha noted the funding announcements for Latina populations. She further noted that the Latina population is often not given attention, but their issues are very similar to what is seen in the Black heterosexual community.</p> <p>Alan appreciated the intergenerational discussions that took place in the GLOW workshop. The conversations were amongst people who have been working in the field awhile, and those who have had different lived experiences. Alan was able to hear from everyone, seeing the threads of commonality, and the new ideas and ways to reinvigorate the work.</p> <p>Rodney attended the Ryan White Conference. He emphasized the data presentations and networking opportunities. Rodney really appreciated the plenary session where Ryan White's mom was able to share. He found it very interesting hearing about where HIV was then, what Ryan White had to endure, and where we are now. Rodney had a moment of sincere gratitude. Rodney also appreciated the data given from the different jurisdictions within the United States and the vendors that share their resources for education, insurance, etc.</p> <p>Rodney was also able to speak with a representative about potentially partnering with them to bring back technical assistance and training for</p>

	organizations that have instituted evidence-based interventions to promote HIV education and prevention.
EHE	<p>Lamont noted that Dr. Christopher Watson (Chauncey) wanted advice from the ISC regarding the draft EHE proposal. In his absence, Lamont and Melvin provided updates on the EHE grant application that's due on October 22, 2024.</p> <p>Lamont indicated there was a meeting yesterday and there will be a cross-jurisdiction collaboration to discuss some of the challenges and the successes they've had in each of the programs. The goal completion date is October 17th. When the final proposal is drafted it will be sent out for comment. Melvin added that the meeting yesterday was reporting on the previous five years for each jurisdiction. DC, Prince George's County, and Montgomery County were in attendance. The new proposal hopes to incorporate new ideas and innovations with emphasis on integration and synergy across jurisdictions. Martha offered to contribute ideas for cisgender and trans women's services.</p>
EFA Rate Update Discussion	<p>Lamont indicated that there were no major updates on EFA. The quandary is still whether the caps can be increased, which will probably lead to less people being serviced or if there's a way for more people to be serviced which may mean a smaller cap on the funding.</p> <p>The CARE team is currently focused on the application. There will be future discussions planned on EFA funding allocations and caps. The GW team offered research support for upcoming discussions.</p>
Other Business	<p>Aging with HIV was identified as a key topic for future meetings. Lamont suggested tabling the discussion until Julie Orban's is able to attend the meeting because she is the main contributor to the application, she is on the committee for aging, and she has close relations with GW. Martha offered her support as a member of the SPNS Aging with HIV Initiative. Once a decision about a meeting is established, she can invite SPNS members to attend. Martha will send Lamont her ideas for cisgender women's services and Lamont will forward Martha's ideas to Dr. Watson and the committee.</p>
