NOTICE OF SUMMARY ACTION TO SUSPEND LICENSE

In accordance with the provisions of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, D.C. Code § 2-509; the District of Columbia Health Occupations Revision Act of 1985, D.C. Code § 3-1205.19(a); and 17 DCMR § 4102.3, the District of Columbia Department of Health (DC Health) gives you notice of the summary suspension of your dental license, No. DEN10010925.

Your license is **summarily suspended** effective immediately upon receipt of this notice. If you wish to appeal this summary suspension of your license, you must file a request for a hearing within 72 hours after service of this notice. Should you request a hearing, one will be held within 72 hours of a timely request, and a decision will be rendered within 72 hours after the close of the hearing. The request for a hearing must be submitted in writing to Carla Williams, Senior Assistant General Counsel, Department of Health, Health Systems and Preparedness Administration, 2201 Shannon Place, SE, 4th Floor, Washington, DC 20020. The District of Columbia (the District) is represented by the Office of the Attorney General for the District of Columbia. A copy of your hearing request and any pleading or other written communication addressed to D.C. Health must also be delivered to Alycia Hogenmiller, Assistant Attorney General (AAG), Office of the Attorney General for the District of Columbia, Civil Enforcement Section, 400 6th Street, NW, Washington, DC 20001. You may appear personally at the hearing, and you may be represented by legal counsel. You have the right to produce witnesses and evidence, to cross-examine witnesses against you, to examine evidence produced, and to have subpoenas issued to require the production of witnesses and evidence.

All hearings are conducted in the English language. If you or any witnesses to be called are deaf, have a hearing impediment, or cannot readily understand or communicate the spoken English language, an application may be made to the Board for the appointment of a qualified interpreter.

A request for a hearing will not stay the suspension of your license.

The summary suspension is based upon the following charge as set forth below.

Charge: **The Commonwealth of Virginia suspended your dental license, for which D.C. Health can summarily suspend your license under D.C. Code § 3-1205.15(a)(1)(A).**

On October 30, 2025, you were sentenced after being found guilty of wire fraud, a felony offense, in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Virginia, Case No. 1:25-CR-210. You were convicted because you applied for a Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) loan for \$83,300 and fraudulently stated the PPP loan was for payroll for four employees. You did not use the PPP loan for payroll and instead had the purported employees transfer the money to you. On November 19, 2025, the Virginia Department of Health Professions (Virginia) suspended your dental license because of your felony conviction. And to date, Virginia has not reinstated your dental license.

Please note under 1 DCMR § 2818, your failure to appear at the time and place set for the hearing, either in person or through counsel, or both, will not preclude D.C. Health proceeding in this matter.
