Ітем	Discussion		
Call to Order	Jenné M. called the meeting to order at 5:05 pm, followed by a moment of silence and introductions.		
Review and Adoption of the Agenda	Jenné assumed the motion to adopt the agenda for May 19, 2022. The agenda was adopted as presented.		
Review and Approval of the Minutes	2022 There were no corrections to the minutes. The minutes were approved		
	The CEEC originally planned for a kick-off event to conduct training for the DMV History Project. However, considering there have been changes with the core group's work assignments and the undergraduate students that were helping are gone for the summer, it was decided to push the event back until the fall.		
DMV History Project Update	Emily spoke with HAHSTA's web team about the DC Ends HIV website and indicated that the website may be a home for the DMV History Project, as well as the EHE podcast.		
	If there is anyone interested in working with the subgroup on this project please let members of CEEC know.		
	Jenné gave a refresher about the D-Seeing project as a collaboration between the GW Intersexuality Research Institute, headed by Jenné, CEEC, HAHSTA, and DC CFAR to help with the Ending The Epidemic (EHE) efforts at HAHSTA. The project is a one year Photovoice project that is the type of research the gives the community members cameras to document their experience rather than the traditional ways of data collection. The pictures and the narratives of the community tell the stories. The goal is to learn more about the social structural barriers to accessing HIV prevention and care services from the community's voice.		
D-Seeing Project	The project has received funding for two (2) key groups, sexual minority black men and black heterosexual women. There are a number of subgroups under these umbrellas to have the group photo discussions with. All meetings will be online. Depending on how the first round goes the group will be expanded to include anyone who sought out HIV prevention services in the city, those who are newly diagnosed, those who are virally suppressed, and/or those not virally suppressed but can or do not have to be in care. These grouping may be reworked.		
	The ultimate goal is to inform the EHE work that is being done as well as having a culminating event/exhibit to share the stories. Jenné asked for suggestions of places, people, and ongoing groups/organizations to inform about the project. Anthony G. suggested joining forces in an outreach		



	 opportunity that would provide a dinner and a half hour presentation, by Anthony, that would complement the D-Seeing project in order to entice participation. In terms of venues, Jed B. suggested the area community health centers and Parents Amplified Voices in Education (PAVE). Anthony suggested the Washington Health Institute with COHAH Commissioner Philip S.,The Women's Collective, NOVA Salud, Us Helping Us with COHAH Commissioner DeMarc Hickson, LaClinica, Community Family Life Services (CFLS) who is being funded to do status neutral activities and the Places of Advisory Board (POWAB). Ken P. suggested DC HIPS, and the Howard University's Master in Social Work program.
	Protocol Implementation Summit Planning The original plan was to send out emails for the summit scheduled the May 19, 2022 in lieu of the CEEC meeting. Anthony indicated that a new date needs to be determined so that he can begin to research venues. It was suggested to have it the week of September 19 th before the General Body Meeting on September 29 th . The summit will be for a whole day with breakfast and lunch provided and a networking mixer afterwards for those who want to stay. All of the health departments can be invited to present their EHE plans and updates. Anthony can give the presentation on the Protocol Implementation Toolkit and facilitate a discussion with organizations that have implemented RAPID Start (ART) and Same Day PrEP and discuss their best practices. There can also be break-out sessions to present an opportunity to apply what has been presented.
Other Business	Jenné suggested having the summit one day and have a sign-up for another day for those who want to do a walkthrough of one of the organizations to view their best practices. Ken agreed and suggested doing a tour first, then the summit, preferably on a Wednesday or Thursday. Ken further suggested the Kaiser Permanente building, the Public Welfare Foundation at 1200 U Street or the community space downtown by the Macy's. Jed suggested the MLK Public Library at Gallery Place or the old Naval Hospital around the corner from Community Connections. Anthony will try to pull together a work group and report back to CEEC. Jenné asked Lamont to send a message through basecamp for anyone interested in joining the work group. Jenné will also announce it at the General Body Meeting on the 26 th .
	Finally, Jenné reported that she is working on developing a training program that has a strong community based research focus that envisions the community component for young, underserved, HIV positive researchers at the institute. The undergraduate and graduate students will be partnered with community preceptors that are already working in the community at different CBOs. Jenné asked if the committee thought it would be useful for CBOs and how it can be designed to be beneficial to the CBOs. Ken says it would be a great information highway. Anthony believes it would be good for capacity



	and investing in black and brown communities. Jenné will also pose the question at the General Body Meeting.
