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CONSENT ORDER

This matter comes before the District of Columbia Board of Medicine (the “Board” or “D.C. Board”) pursuant to the Health Occupations Revision Act (HORA). D.C. Official Code § 3-1201.01, *et seq.* (2016 Repl.). The HORA authorizes the Board to regulate the practice of medicine in the District of Columbia. The Board has broad jurisdiction to impose a variety of disciplinary sanctions upon a finding of a violation of the HORA. D.C. Official Code, § 3-1201.03; *Mannan v. District of Columbia Board of Medicine*, 558 A.2d 329, 333 (D.C. 1989). The Council of the District of Columbia, in amending the HORA, “intended to strengthen enforcement of its licensing laws.” *Davidson v. District of Columbia Board of Medicine*, 562 A.2d 109, 113 (D.C. 1989). And the HORA “was designed to ‘address modern advances and community needs with the paramount consideration of protecting the public interest.’” *Joseph v. District of Columbia Board of Medicine*, 587 A.2d 1085, 1088 (D.C. 1991) (*quoting* Report of the D.C. Council on Consumer and Regulatory Affairs on Bill 6-317, at 7 (November 26, 1985)) (emphasis added by court).

Background

Dr. Lisa Majete (Respondent) has been licensed to practice medicine in the District of Columbia since December 12, 2000. Her license expires December 31, 2024. Respondent also practices in Virginia.

On June 26, 2024, the Virginia Board of Medicine issued a Consent Order (Virginia Consent Order) with Respondent which reprimanded her license and assessed a one thousand dollar (\$1000.00) fine. The Consent Order resulted from a finding that “she allowed a medical assistant working with her to provide care without sufficient direct and immediate supervision Between April and June 2021.” (Virginia Consent Order p.1). The Order states:

Specifically, by Dr. Majete’s admission, on three occasions she authorized and allowed a medical assistant, who is not a licensed health provider, to administer Juvederm (hyaluronic acid dermal filler) and/or Botox (botulinum toxin) cosmetic injections to Individual A, although Dr. Majete had not completed an in-person examination of Individual A. Dr. Majete stated that, based on photos of Individual A and medical intake forms taken by a medical assistant, she determined the treatment plan in conjunction with the medical assistant, then instructed the medical assistant on injection sites by noting such on a facial diagram. Notably, the medical assistant signed several of Individual A’s treatment records as the “Provider,” and Dr. Majete signed as providing “Chart Review/Authorization” of “Physician Co/Signature.”
Virginia Consent Order pp. 1-2.

Respondent paid her fine and the Virginia Consent Order was closed on July 10, 2024.

The Board considered the Virginia Consent Order and closure at its meeting on September 25, 2024, and voted to take reciprocal disciplinary action against Respondent’s District of Columbia medical license. Respondent and the Board now agree to enter into this Consent Order.

Conclusions of Law

The D.C. Board is authorized, pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 3-1205.14(a)(3), to take reciprocal action when a respondent has been disciplined by a licensing authority of another

jurisdiction for conduct that would be grounds for Board action. In pertinent part, D.C. Official Code § 3-1205.14(a)(3) states:

Each board, subject to the right of a hearing as provided by this subchapter, on an affirmative vote of a quorum of its appointed members may take one or more of the disciplinary actions...against any person permitted by this subchapter to practice a health occupation regulated by the board in the District who is **disciplined by a licensing or disciplinary authority...of any jurisdiction for conduct that would be grounds for disciplinary action under this section.** (emphasis added)

Respondent's conduct in Virginia violated D.C. Official Code § 3-125.14(a)(12) (willfully practices a health occupation with an unauthorized person or aids an unauthorized person in the practice of a health occupation) and D.C. Official Code § 3-1205.14(a)(26) (fails to conform to standards of acceptable conduct and prevailing practice within a health profession).

Accordingly, Respondent's conduct has provided the Board with a basis in law and fact to take action against Respondent under the authority of D.C. Official Code §§ 3-1205.14(a)(3), (12) and (26).

ORDER

Based on the forgoing, it is by the District of Columbia Board of Medicine hereby, **ORDERED**, that Respondent's license is **REPRIMANDED**; and it is further **ORDERED** that Respondent shall pay a fine of one thousand dollars (\$1000.00) within three (3) months of the execution date of this Consent Order (that is, the date that the Consent Order is signed by the Board Chair). The fine shall be paid by check or money order to the order of "D.C. Treasurer" and mailed, along with a copy of this Consent Order, to: D.C. Board of Medicine, DC Health, 2nd Floor, 2201 Shannon Place SE, Washington D.C. 20021; and it is further

ORDERED that Respondent shall comply with all laws, rules, and regulations of the District of Columbia, while within its jurisdiction;

ORDERED, that if Respondent fails to satisfactorily fulfill the terms of this Consent Order the Board may issue a notice of intent to take additional formal disciplinary action against Respondent's license; and it is further

ORDERED, that this is a public document.
