	 DC Health is scheduled to relocate at the end of February 2024. The last day at 89 North Capitol St is set for February 23, and the first day at the new building is locate at 2201 Shannon Place SE is planned for February 26th.
	 On October 5th, the Committee on Health convened a confirmation hearing, durin which Acting Director Bennett articulated her eagerness and qualifications for the position. Following a unanimous vote of support from the committee members, he nomination was approved by the Council on November 7th.

compact is not operational but is scheduled to start accepting applications in mid-2024.

New License Type/Pathway

• DC Health is exploring different license types and license type pathways for licensure. The agency is looking to modify the endorsement license requirements and investigate the possibility of reciprocity pathways with Maryland and Virgina.

Board Vacancies/MOTA Update

- We've recently welcomed a new MOTA liaison on board, as Ms. Vida Rangel has taken up a new position elsewhere. Ms. Tierra Williams is our new liaison and will be responsible for coordinating with DOH matters related to board appointments, reappointments, and filling vacancies.
- The Board currently has two (2*) board member vacancies. One (2) occupational therapist and one (1) consumer member. However, one of the occupational therapist vacancies is pending approval.

Legislative Updates

Health Professional Compact Bills:

- Councilmember Gray has introduced bills that would have the District join two health professional licensing compacts:
 - The Occupational Therapy Licensure Compact Approval Act of 2023 (B25-0286) would have the District join the Occupational Therapy Licensure Compact and applies to Occupational Therapists and Occupational Therapy Assistants. The compact is not operational but is scheduled to start accepting applications in mid-2024.
 - The Counseling Compact Approval Act of 2023 (<u>B25-0287</u>) would have the District join the Counseling Compact and applies to Licensed Professional Counselors (LPCs).
- Additionally, Councilmember Frumin has introduced the *District of Columbia Nurse* Licensure Compact Authorization Act of 2023 (B25-0430) which applies to Registered Nurses (RNs) and Licensed Practical Nurses (LPNs).
- A hearing was held for the Occupational Therapy and Counseling Compacts on <u>December 7th</u>. During the hearing, the Council heard testimony from public witnesses, including local advocacy organizations. DC Health testified on both testimonies and expressed support for increased licensure portability. However, DC Health did also raise some concerns with joining each of the compacts.

Health Professional Licensing Boards Residency Requirement Amendment Act of 2023:

- Councilmembers Henderson and Parker introduced the Health Professional Licensing Boards Residency Requirement Amendment Act of 2023 (B25-0312) on June 2, 2023.
 - This legislation would permit non-District residents to serve on health professional licensing boards.

0	There would be restrictions, including that the Board Chair and Consumer
	Members would continue to need to be District residents and no more than
	50% of the Board could be made up of non-District residents.

- This bill received a hearing on July 13, 2023. DC Health testified during this hearing and expressed support for the need for innovative solutions to fill board vacancies and offered some changes to the bill. It was voted out of the Committee on Health during a markup on <u>September 26th</u> and was passed on first reading by the Committee of the Whole on October 3rd.
- The bill passed on final reading on November 7th and was signed by the Mayor on November 21st. It is now undergoing Congressional Review.

DC Health Director Appointment:

- On June 8th, Mayor Bowser <u>announced</u> the appointment of Dr. Ayanna Bennett as DC Health Acting Director.
 - Dr. Bennett is a healthcare and public health executive with more than 20 years of experience in clinical practice, clinical service design, system integration, and quality improvement. Dr. Bennett most recently served as Chief Health Equity Officer and Director of the San Francisco Department of Public Health's Office of Health Equity.
- The Committee on Health held a confirmation hearing on October 5th. During the roundtable, Acting Director Bennett expressed her eagerness and excitement to take on the role, highlighting her qualifications for the position. The hearing also included testimonies from members of the public who voiced their support for the new director and discussed the key issues they hope the Director will prioritize.
- Acting Director Bennett's nomination was unanimously voted out of the Committee on Health and was then unanimously approved by the entire Council on November 7th.

Health Occupations Revision Act (HORA) Update:

- DC Health worked on a significant revision of the HORA. This would be the first significant revision in seventeen years.
- The revised HORA received Mayoral approval and has been introduced in the Council as the *Health Occupations Revision General Amendment Act of 2023* (B25-0545).
- This legislation received a hearing on <u>December 7th</u>. Over 80 witnesses, many of whom were healthcare professionals, signed up to provide testimony. DC Health's Associate Director of Health Professional Licensing Boards provided testimony in support and answered questions from the Council.

	information and presents numerous quick interventions utilizing positioning and	
	ventilatory strategies. Clinical cases will be used throughout the day to illustrate concepts.	
	The course applies to any pediatric or adult patient (or therapist) breathes! Participants	
	are encouraged to follow up later with "LINKED Part-2," a two-day in-person lab course,	
	assessing "normal" breathing patterns, learning neuromotor retraining techniques, and	
	learning manual assistive cough techniques.
