OS-0419-02	Compact for State Boards of Psychology: Update: Pending departmental decision/position regarding entering into a jurisdictional agreement, which is a legislative function. Packground: The Psychology Interioristic dictional Compact is an interstate.	
	<u>Background:</u> The Psychology Interjurisdictional Compact is an interstate compact designed to facilitate practice of psychology across jurisdictional boundaries developed by ASPPB. The ASPPB is encouraging member boards to join the compact to assist licensees with cross jurisdictional practice and consumers with additional access to practitioners.	
OS-0419-03	<u>Telepsychology Requirements:</u> <u>Update:</u> The board reviewed the information on ASPPB telepsychology and decided to incorporate the ASPPB rules/guidelines on telepsychology into their regulations.	
OS-0419-04	Psychology Law Updates: Update: Interested subcommittee candidates submitted their resume and statements. Background: In November 2016, the board voted to remove from the psychology law exemption from licensure for school psychologists and require school psychologists to obtain license. In July 2017, the board decided to adopt the practice definition of the ASPPB Model Act. In October, the board requested to form voluntary subcommittee who will	
	review the current laws and regulations to make recommendation to the board as it updates the regulations and law. Email was sent to the public.
