NOTICE OF SUMMARY ACTION TO SUSPEND LICENSE

In accordance with the provisions of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, D.C. Code § 2–509; the District of Columbia Health Occupations Revision Act of 1985, D.C. Code § 3–1205.15(a)1(A); and 17 DCMR § 4118.1, the District of Columbia Department of Health (D.C. Health) gives you notice of the summary suspension of your Medical License No. DO210001719, under D.C. Code § 3–1205.15(a).

Your license is summarily suspended **effective immediately** upon the receipt of this notice. If you wish to appeal this summary suspension of your license, you must file a request for a hearing within 72 hours after service of this notice. Should you request a hearing, one will be held within 72 hours of a timely request, and a decision will be rendered within 72 hours after the close of the hearing. The request for a hearing must be submitted in writing to Suzanne Fenzel, Assistant General Counsel, Department of Health, Health Licensing Regulation Administration by email to Suzanne.Fenzel3@dc.gov or by mail to 2201 Shannon Pl., S.E., Sixth Floor, Washington, D.C. 20002. The District of Columbia is represented by the Office of the Attorney General for the District of Columbia. A copy of your hearing request and any pleading or other written communication addressed to the D.C. Health must also be delivered to Anthony P. Celo, Assistant Attorney General, at the Office of the Attorney General for the District of Columbia, Civil Enforcement Section, 400 Sixth Street, N.W., Suite 10100, Washington, D.C. 20001. You may appear personally at the hearing, and you may be represented by legal counsel. You have the right to produce witnesses and evidence, to cross-examine witnesses against you,

to examine evidence produced, and to have subpoenas issued to require the production of witnesses and evidence.

All hearings are conducted in the English language. If you or any witnesses to be called are deaf, have a hearing impediment, or cannot readily understand or communicate the spoken English language, an application may be made to the Board for the appointment of a qualified interpreter.

The charge upon which the summary suspension is based is set forth below.

Charge:

The State of Maryland suspended your medical license, for which D.C. Health may summarily suspend your District license under D.C. Code § 3–1205.15(a)(1)(A).

On October 23, 2024, the Maryland Board of Medicine (Maryland Board) suspended your license to practice medicine in Maryland, License No. H94067, in Case No. 2225-0050 A. On November 6, 2024, following a post-deprivation hearing, Disciplinary Panel A of the Maryland Board reaffirmed the summary suspension order. The summary suspension orders stemmed from an investigation by the Maryland Board which found that you engaged in a pattern of sexually harassing at least four female employees from April 2024 to May 2024 and a finding that your continued practice of medicine presented "a substantial likelihood of risk of serious harm to the public health, safety, and welfare." Order for Summary Suspension of License to Practice Medicine, p. 9; 11/7/24 Maryland Board Letter, ¶ 2. The Maryland Board ordered that "during the course of the summary suspension, [you] shall not practice medicine in the State of Maryland." Order for Summary Suspension of License to Practice Medicine, p. 9. To date, your medical license in Maryland has not been reinstated.

Please note that under 17 DCMR § 4103.2, your failure to appear at the time and place set for the hearing, either in person or through counsel, or both, will not preclude the Board's proceeding in this matter.
