OS-0915- 03	<p>EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR’S REPORT</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Operational Status Update • Licensure Census CAC1-86 CAC2-152 LGPC-400 LPC-1645 • Legislative Update: <p>Pathways to Behavioral Health Degrees Act of 2023:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Councilmember Robert White has reintroduced the <i>Pathways to Behavioral Health Degrees Act of 2023</i> (B25-0055), which would establish the Behavioral Health and Human Services Scholarship Program administered by UDC for students with bachelor’s degrees seeking to obtain an accredited master’s degree required for licensure by the Board of Social Work or the Board of Professional Counseling. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ The scholarship funds will pay for UDC tuition, academic costs such as books and supplies, a monthly stipend toward living expenses and transportation, and fees associated with obtaining a license for a behavioral health occupation in the District. Both District residents and employees are eligible for the program. ○ Once a participant completes their master’s program and obtains licensure, they are required to work in a behavioral health occupation at a District local education agency, government agency, or health care provider organization for at least two years. • Funding for this legislation was added into the proposed FY 2024 budget (\$1.2 million). This legislation received a hearing in the Committee of the Whole on July 12th. <p>Health Professional Compact Bills:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Councilmember Gray has introduced bills that would have the District join two health professional licensing compacts: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ The <i>Occupational Therapy Licensure Compact Approval Act of 2023</i> (B25-0286) would have the District join the Occupational Therapy Licensure Compact and applies to Occupational Therapists and Occupational Therapy 	

	<p>Assistants. The compact is not operational but is scheduled to start accepting applications in mid-2024.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ The <i>Counseling Compact Approval Act of 2023</i> (B25-0287) would have the District join the Counseling Compact and applies to Licensed Professional Counselors (LPCs). ● Additionally, Councilmember Frumin has introduced the <i>District of Columbia Nurse Licensure Compact Authorization Act of 2023</i> (B25-0430) which applies to Registered Nurses (RNs) and Licensed Practical Nurses (LPNs). ● DC Health is evaluating these bills and here will likely be hearings this fall. <p>DC Health Director Appointment:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● On June 8th, Mayor Bowser announced the appointment of Dr. Ayanna Bennett as DC Health Acting Director. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Dr. Bennett is a healthcare and public health executive with more than 20 years of experience in clinical practice, clinical service design, system integration, and quality improvement. Dr. Bennett most recently served as Chief Health Equity Officer and Director of the San Francisco Department of Public Health’s Office of Health Equity. ● The Council will hold a hearing on the <i>Director of the Department of Health Dr. Ayanna Bennett Confirmation Resolution of 2023</i> (PR25-0290). <p>OS-FY1</p>	<p><u>Supervised Practice Form</u></p> <p><u>Update:</u> Pending the subcommittee meeting.</p> <p><u>Background:</u> A supervised practice form is listed under section 9105.8 regarding the supervised experience requirement which requires the supervisor(s) to submit the completed form to the Board. The purpose of the graduate professional counseling license is to allow individual to practice under supervision of a licensed professional counselor. However, the regulations also indicate a supervisor or supervisee shall submit a supervised practice form within 2 weeks of commencing supervision. In March 2022, the Board tabled to address the supervised practice form for the subcommittee.</p>
