FY-01	<p><u>Endorsement Requirements/Reciprocity Pathway</u></p> <p><u>Update:</u> Pending the discussion with Maryland and Virginia Board.</p> <p><u>Background:</u> In attempt to provide easier pathways to licensure, we are requesting each board to discuss and evaluate the following possibilities: Endorsement requirements, reciprocity pathways, and DMV reciprocity pathways.</p> <p>In July 2023, the Board voted to have a conversation with Virginia and Maryland Licensing Boards to access the availabilities of the reciprocity pathway.</p>
FY-02	<p><u>Discussions on Assisted Living Administrator Examination</u></p> <p><u>Update:</u> Pending the formation of the subcommittee.</p> <p><u>Background:</u> The Board would need to discuss the implementation of the national and jurisprudence examinations for the Assisted Living Administrator licensure. In addition, discussion on development of a board approved assisted living regulation jurisprudence course.</p> <p>In July 2023, the board requested to create a subcommittee to address this matter.</p> <p>Ms. LaTrice Herndon, Executive Director, and Mr. Ajay Gohil, Board Attorney, have reviewed candidate resumes submitted by members of the board and found that none of the submissions would be suitable for the assisted living administrator examination subcommittee. As a result, Ms. Herndon reached out to the National Association of Long-Term Care Administrator Boards (NAB) and had a discussion meeting in regard to putting together a jurisprudence exam for DC Health. NAB is willing to assist with drafting the ALA examination. Follow-up meetings between the executive director and NAB are forthcoming.</p>

The Board attorney Mr. Gohil shared the regulation section:

- *11304.1 An applicant for an assisted living administrator license shall demonstrate to the Board’s satisfaction that he or she possesses competent knowledge and understanding of the laws and rules pertaining to assisted living administration in the District. The Board may adopt or implement a District of Columbia Assisted Living Administration Jurisprudence Examination or other methods such as mandatory educational sessions to ensure that an applicant meets the requirement of this section.*

In December 2023, the board voted to authorize the Board staff to communicate with NAB to assist with the jurisprudence exam.
