Background:

Flex Therapist organization has submitted fifteen (15) applications for CEU approval. The applications have been sent to the Board Chair for initial review.

OS-1223-10 Breathing and Postural Control Part 1 and 2 Board action:

The Board is to determine whether to approve the Breathing and Postural Control Part 1 for 8 contact hours and Part 2 for 13 contact hours.

Background:

This course proposes a new definition of "core stability," redefining it as the dynamic control of trunk pressures to optimize postural stability (balance). Part 1 lays foundational information and presents numerous quick interventions utilizing positioning and ventilatory strategies. Clinical cases will be used throughout the day to illustrate concepts. The course applies to any pediatric or adult patient (or therapist) breathes! Participants are encouraged to follow up later with "LINKED Part-2," a two-day in-person lab course, assessing "normal" breathing patterns, learning neuromotor retraining techniques, and learning manual assistive cough techniques.
