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• The Board will continue to explore more in detail the different license types and license type pathways for licensure. The agency is looking to modify the endorsement license requirements and investigate the possibility of reciprocity pathways.

Social Work License Modernization Amendment Act of 2023:

- Councilmember R. White has introduced the Social Work License Modernization Amendment Act of 2023 (B25-0259) along with nine other Councilmembers (including four members of the Committee on Health).
  - The bill prevents the Board of Social Work from requiring that Licensed Social Work Associates (LSWA) and Licensed Graduate Social Workers (LGSW) pass an examination to attain a license. The legislation also requires the creation of a Social Work Licensure Task Force.
- A hearing was held on September 21, 2023.

#### **Board Vacancies/MOTA Update**

The Board of Physical Therapy currently has two (2) openings left on the Board of Physical Therapy. If you are considering becoming a member, please note the following requirements:

- The individual must be a DC resident, not an allied behavioral health professional.
- Must be licensed in physical therapy profession for at least 3 years.
- Cannot be DC government employee or work for any type of DC government subsidiary.
- Must not be related to anyone currently on the Board.
- Must be in good standing in the community.

#### Advisory Committees

• This Fall, the Board of Physical Therapy is organizing a subcommittee to revise their regulations. All licensed Physical Therapists in the district will be receiving a notice from the Board. If you are interested in participating, please contact the Board.

	<ul> <li>The Occupational Therapy Licensure Compact Approval Act of 2023 (B25-0286) would have the District join the Occupational Therapy Licensure Compact and applies to Occupational Therapists and Occupational Therapy Assistants. The compact is not operational but is scheduled to start accepting applications in mid-2024.</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>The Counseling Compact Approval Act of 2023 (<u>B25-0287</u>) would have the District join the Counseling Compact and applies to Licensed Professional Counselors (LPCs).</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>Additionally, Councilmember Frumin has introduced the <i>District of Columbia</i> <i>Nurse Licensure Compact Authorization Act of 2023</i> (<u>B25-0430</u>) which applies to Registered Nurses (RNs) and Licensed Practical Nurses (LPNs).</li> <li>DC Health is evaluating these bills and anticipates they will receive a hearing later this fall.</li> </ul>
