OS-0120-04	OPEN SESSION CONSENT AGENDA:	
OS-0120-05	SENIOR DEPUTY REPORT: Dr. Vito DelVento reports on behalf of Dr. Sharon Lewis. She extends a Thank You to The Board of Veterinary Medicine for their continues efforts and commitment. She had nothing specific to report.	
OS-0120-06	ASSOCIATE DIRECTOR'S REPORT: Dr. Vito DelVento reports on behalf of Mr. Arain Gibson. He is our Interim Associate Director after Mr. Frank Meyers' departure. Mr. Gibson could not join the meeting due to some other engagements. He had nothing specific to report.	
OS-0120-07	Dr. Vito DelVento reports that the renewal cycle has come to an end on December 31, 2021 in terms of the official timeframe. We have jurisdictions over 407 veterinarians. So far, 299 renewal applications have been approved. There is still a 60-day period after the December 31 deadline to submit your renewal application with a late fee. Dr. DelVento further reports that the Mayor's Office of Talent and Appointments (MOTA) has been moving forward with a potential candidate's application for an open position on this board and he hopes to have a confirmation from the office within a couple of weeks. MOTA will also name someone as the board's chair. Dr. DelVento reports that Ms. Erica Loadman from the Pharmacy department of DC Health reached out to him to gain insights into the diversion and abuse of the veterinary drug, Xylazine, in the District. On January 11, 2022, Ms. Loadman wrote in her email to Dr. DelVento: "As Xylazine has become more prevalent in the illicit drug supply, the DC PDMP is making an effort to understand whether changes to program regulations would help to reduce diversion and abuse. During the most recent DC PDMP Advisory Committee meeting, committee members were given a high-level overview of Xylazine abuse and expressed the need to	



learn more about this topic from several expert perspectives so that an informed decision can be made. As someone with expertise in the field of veterinary medicine, we are interested in hearing your perspective and understanding of this issue." To this email, Dr. DelVento responded, "I do not know of anyone using xylazine. I know that the practices that I visit regularly are not using xylazine. Xylazine is very commonly utilized in large animal practice specifically Equine Practice as both a sedative and a tranquilizer." When this question was asked during the board meeting, the board members agreed to Dr. DelVento's response. Dr. Megan McAndrew from the Humane Rescue Alliance (HRA) who was present as a member of the public and who is also a veterinarian said that Xylazine is used wildly in shelter medicine setting as part of a pre-anesthetic and pre-euthanasia protocols. Dr. Dan Teich requested having a member join the DC PDMP Advisory Committee as a voice for the veterinary profession. Dr. DelVento will forward this request to the PDMP team at DC Health. OS-0120-08 ANIMAL SERVICES PROGRAM REPORT (ASP) Dr. DelVento reports that our rabies surveillance continues as it always does. Our arbovirus surveillance program will resume in May-June timeframe. Most facilities in the District now have their new registrations and he's in the process of inspecting the remaining facilities. The special animal permit process for large venues during the holiday season went well and this process will pick up again during the spring season. OS-0120-09 **BOARD CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT** OS-0120-10 **BOARD COUNSELOR'S REPORT** Mr. Ed Rich reports that since September 1, 2021, all healthcare professionals including the veterinarians in the District of Columbia are required to get fully vaccinated for Covid19. This is one of the requirements to get your renewal applications approved and therefore, those who are not vaccinated should submit a request for a medical or a religious exemption. Mr. Ed Rich further reports that the standard of care regulations that the council passed a few years ago was published back in December and the 30-

day review period is now over and they have not received any positive or



	negative feedback. The final version of the standard of care regulations will be published soon.

<u>Veterinarian, Veterinarian Technician, Veterinarian Euthanasia</u> Technician Regulations

The new Veterinary Technician and Euthanasia Technicians regulations became effective Friday, August 6, 2021. At this time, the DC Department of Health will not be issuing registrations until the process is in place.

The Department of Health is currently creating the platform by which individuals can submit an application for registration as either a Veterinary Technician or a Veterinary Euthanasia Technician. Once the platform is available, there will be a grace period for which individuals will need to come into full compliance.
