*Please note that there is a difference between ‘active licenses’ and ‘approved renewal applications’ because veterinarians who applied after September 2, 2021 (90 days before the license expiration date, they were approved with an expiration date of December 31, 2023, and they were exempt from submitting a renewal application.)*

Dr. Vito DelVento reports that the license renewal period with a late fee has come to an end on March 1, 2022. Licenses that have not been renewed have expired after March 1 and licensees will now have an option to reinstate their licenses.

Board members now have an opportunity to randomly select 10 per cent of the renewed applications and review them for their CE credit hours.

OS-0317-08	<p><b><u>ANIMAL SERVICES PROGRAM REPORT (ASP)</u></b></p> <p>Dr. Vito DelVento reports that our rabies surveillance continues as it always does. Our 2022 arbovirus surveillance program will resume in May/early June, and right now we are in the preparatory phase.</p> <p>We are seeing a little bit of an uptick in specialty permits for animals coming into the District as spring is upon us and Covid19 restrictions are gradually lifting so, there will be more activity as the weather will get warmer.</p> <p>Regarding the avian influenza outbreak, Dr. DelVento reports that City Wildlife Inc. as well as DC Health partners in Virginia and Maryland are monitoring avian influenza both in the domestic flock population as well as wildlife population.</p> <p>Dr. Chooljian states that the only concerns for wildlife for North America especially in the DMV region are for white-tailed deer. They are not tested positive in the District and surrounding areas but they are tested positive in many states throughout the United States including Ohio and New York.</p>	
OS-0317-09	<p><b><u>BOARD CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT</u></b></p> <p>Dr. Dan Teich and Amy Haywood report that they will be serving on the DC Board of Veterinary Medicine for the next term also.</p> <p>Dr. DelVento reports that the Mayor's Office of Talent and Appointments (MOTA) has been moving forward with a potential candidate's application for an open position on this board and he hopes to have a confirmation from the office within a couple of weeks. MOTA will also name someone as the board's chair.</p>
