OS-1215-08	ANIMAL SERVICES PROGRAM REPORT (ASP)	
	Dr. Vito DelVento reports that the District residents have been utilizing the online dog licensing portal and DC Health has been regularly issuing dog licenses without any issues. 	Dr. DelVento reports that our rabies surveillance continues as it always does. Our 2022 arbovirus surveillance program has come to an end now and we are in the process of putting arbovirus data in the national database. There is going to be less animal related activity in winter months. With regards to Avian influenza, Dr. Vito DelVento reports that the first case of Avian influenza was confirmed by the National Zoo in October. The cause of death of the bird was blunt trauma and upon necropsy Avian Influenza detected as an incidental finding. Dr. Dan Teich reports that leptospirosis is back in the District, and it was recently reported by the Friendship Animal Hospital. A daycare center also reported a leptospirosis case. Dr. Teich further added that leptospirosis vaccine should be considered a core vaccination because there's an uptick in the number of positive cases this year.

OS-1215-10	Mr. Ed Rich reports that Bill 24-560 has been introduced in the Council. The bill has been proposed to make changes pertaining to domestic animal care and animal control operations. It would authorize animal control vehicles to operate emergency lights and sirens when responding to life	



	threatening emergencies. It allows the Washington Humane Society to recover costs incurred boarding animals during a pending criminal or other proceeding. The legislation also addresses pet ownership in divorce cases.

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	Mr. Matteo Lieb further elaborated upon Bill 24-0560. The Committee on the Judiciary and Public Safety, to which the Bill was referred, met on November 22, 2022 and recommended approval of the Bill by the Council. Veterinarian, Veterinarian Technician, Veterinarian Euthanasia Technician Regulations The new Veterinary Technician and Euthanasia Technicians regulations became effective Friday, August 6, 2021. At this time, the DC Department of Health will not be issuing registrations until the process is in place. The Department of Health is currently creating the platform by which individuals can submit an application for registration as either a Veterinary Technician or a Veterinary Euthanasia Technician. Once the platform is available, there will be a grace period for which individuals will need to come into full compliance.
