Mid-June updates

Race Standards: New standards have been recommended by the RACE Committee and approved by the AAVSB Board of Directors. The standards will be effective and available on the AAVSB website on July 1, 2023, for all programs, both new and renewals. A Town Hall for RACE Providers will be held on June 21 to help answer any questions regarding the revised standards.

AVMA: The VAULT team and executive staff will be at the AVMA conference this July in Denver Colorado between July 14 and July 18, 2023.

AVTE Convention at the Westin Rancho Mirage in California between August 4 and August 6, 2023

Quebec applies to AAVSB: The Quebec Board of Veterinary Medicine has formally applied to the AAVSB to become a Member Board and meets the requirements of the AAVSB Bylaws' definition of a Member Board.

AAVSB Veterinary Team Task Expansion Study: The AAVSB is undertaking a survey developed by a task force composed of stakeholders from the veterinary community. The survey seeks to identify potential opportunities to address the veterinary workforce shortage through expansion of task delegation within veterinary practice.





Bylaw Amendments: During the AAVSB's Business Session for the upcoming 2023 Annual Meeting & Conference, the Delegate Assembly will vote on proposed Bylaws amendments.

Practice Ace Model Updates

During the 2023 AAVSB Annual Meeting & Conference, Delegates will be asked to vote on the updated AAVSB <u>Practice Act Model (PAM)</u> to reaffirm the document as a Member Board resource available in response to or as a stimulus of statutory and regulatory updates.

AAVSB Survey to Veterinary Professionals

For the last 18 months, the AAVSB has collaborated with a range of experts, including regulators, professional veterinary and veterinary technician associations, academics, private practice representatives, state governments, and psychometricians. Together, they have developed a comprehensive survey to assess tasks within the veterinary team and the potential and interest for delegation of those tasks. **This survey** will be





distributed to a portion of veterinarians and credentialed veterinary technicians throughout North America. Mid-July updates VTNE Townhall: July 27, 2023 1pm US Central Time, Via Zoom The AAVSB's VTNE Content Outline has been updated and will go into effect on August 15th, 2023. OS-0720-15 **LEGISLATIVE/REGULATIONS PDMP** Mr. Matteo Lieb provided the following updates: **Federal Spouse Licensure:** Congress has recently passed legislation to reduce barriers for military spouses to gaining licensure in new jurisdictions. This legislation, the Veterans Auto and Education Improvement Act of 2022 (H.R. 7939), went into effect on January 5th, 2023. This new law intends to ensure that military spouses with professional licensure in good standing in other states can practice in new states where their spouses are relocated. The Office of Health Professional Licensing Boards and the Office of the General Counsel (OGC) are working to establish a process by which military spouses could attain privileges to practice in the District. **Board Membership Legislation:** Councilmembers Henderson and Parker introduced the Health Professional Licensing Boards Residency Requirement Amendment Act of 2023 (B25-0312) on June 2, 2023. This legislation would permit non-District residents to serve on health professional licensing boards. o There would be restrictions, including that the Board Chair and Consumer Members would continue to need to be District residents and no more than 50% of the Board could be made up of non-District residents.





 This bill received a hearing on <u>July 13, 2023</u>. DC Health testified during this hearing and expressed support for the need for innovative solutions to fill board vacancies and offered some changes to the bill.

DC Health Director Appointment:

- On June 8th, Mayor Bowser <u>announced</u> the appointment of Dr. Ayanna Bennett as DC Health Acting Director.
 - Dr. Bennett is a healthcare and public health executive with more than 20 years of experience in clinical practice, clinical service design, system integration, and quality improvement. Dr. Bennett most recently served as Chief Health Equity Officer and Director of the San Francisco Department of Public Health's Office of Health Equity.
- The Council will therefore consider the Director of the Department of Health Dr. Ayanna Bennett Confirmation Resolution of 2023 (PR25-0290). The Committee on Health will hold a hearing to discuss this resolution.

Council Recess:

 Council went on recess effective July 14 and will return to session on September 15.

<u>Veterinarian, Veterinarian Technician, Veterinarian Euthanasia Technician</u> Regulations

The new Veterinary Technician and Euthanasia Technicians regulations became effective Friday, August 6, 2021. At this time, the DC Department of Health will not be issuing registrations until the process is in place.

The Department of Health is currently creating the platform by which individuals can submit an application for registration as either a Veterinary Technician or a Veterinary Euthanasia Technician. Once the platform is available, there will be a grace period for which individuals will need to come into full compliance.
