During the September meeting, the Board tabled this discussion and requested a representative from the American Association of State Counseling Boards (AASCB) speak about their proposed endorsement process. A member of AASCB will present to the Board.

Motion:

Ms. Ferreri made a motion to review endorsement applicants using the HORA's general endorsement process. Additionally, if applicants do not meet the normal endorsement requirements but have been practicing for 5-years, they may be reviewed under the specific LPC provision of DC Code 3-1207.10(c). The Board also moved to adopt the interpretive recommendation that, to streamline processing, evidence of 5 years of practice (required by 3-1207.10(c)(5) will be accepted as evidence that the applicants also meet the requirements of 3-1207.10(c)(2)-(4). Seconded by Ms. Sherk.

Vote:
