



# Oral Medications for the Treatment of COVID-19 Illness Information for Persons with COVID-19 and Caregivers

# What oral medications are available for the treatment of COVID-19 illness?

For persons with COVID-19 who are not hospitalized but are at high risk of severe illness, treatments for COVID-19 are available in Washington DC.

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has given two oral COVID-19 antiviral medications Emergency Use Authorization (EUA): Paxlovid (Pfizer) and Molnupiravir (Merck).

This document contains information for patients or caregivers for whom treatment with these antivirals is recommended.

## What are these oral medications called?

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has given Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) to the following two oral COVID-19 antiviral medications:

- Paxlovid (Pfizer)
- Molnupiravir (Merck)

#### Are these medications effective?

According to information provided by the manufacturers, Paxlovid (Pfizer) reduces the risk of hospitalization or death from COVID-19 by 89% and Molnupiravir (Merck) reduces the risk of hospitalization or death from COVID-19 by 30%.

#### How are these medications taken?

These medications are available as pills. Treatment must be started within the first 5 days of illness.

# Do I have to have a positive COVID-19 test to take these medications?

Persons must have a positive test result for COVID-19 to be eligible to receive these medications.

#### Can I take one of these oral antiviral COVID-19 treatments?

Due to the limited supply of treatment courses available; the medications will be restricted to use by people who have the highest likelihood to become severely ill from COVID-19. Patients are eligible for these medications if they:

- Have positive tests for the COVID-19 virus (SARS-CoV-2),
- Are **not** hospitalized,
- Have mild to moderate illness,
- Have had symptoms for five days or less, and
- Are at high risk to develop severe COVID-19 because of:
  - Age 65 years or older;
  - Age > 12 (for Paxlovid) or >18 (for molnupiravir) and have any of the conditions that increase the risk of severe illness listed by the CDC at <u>cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/need-extra-precautions/people-with-medical-conditions.html</u>

# How and where can I get obtain these medications?

To obtain these medications, **you must have a prescription** for them from a medical provider licensed to prescribe drugs in the District of Columbia. These prescriptions can be filled at select pharmacies in Washington, DC. Bring your insurance card to the pharmacy.

Paxlovid appears more effective than Molnupiravir, but there are fewer doses of Paxlovid available. For this reason, your health care provider may give you prescriptions for both medications. You should fill only one prescription. If both are available, you should fill the prescription for Paxlovid. If only Molnupiravir is available, you should fill the prescription for Molnupiravir. You should NOT take both Paxlovid and Molnupiravir.

The medications themselves are available at no cost. Pharmacies may charge a fee to dispense them, by this fee should be covered by health insurance.

Paxlovid and Molnupiravir are distributed through selected pharmacies in Washington, DC including retail pharmacies and healthcare facility outpatient pharmacy locations.
