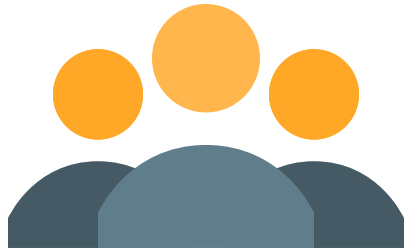

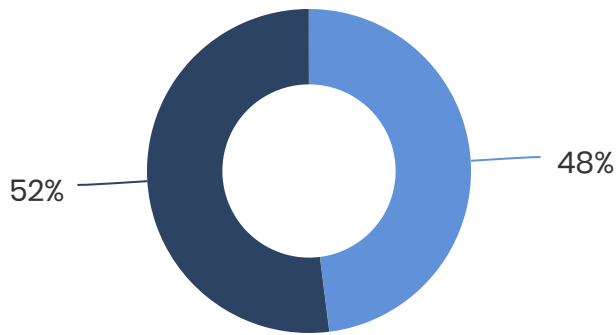

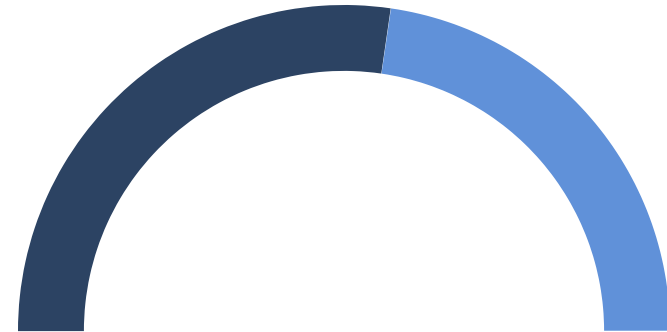

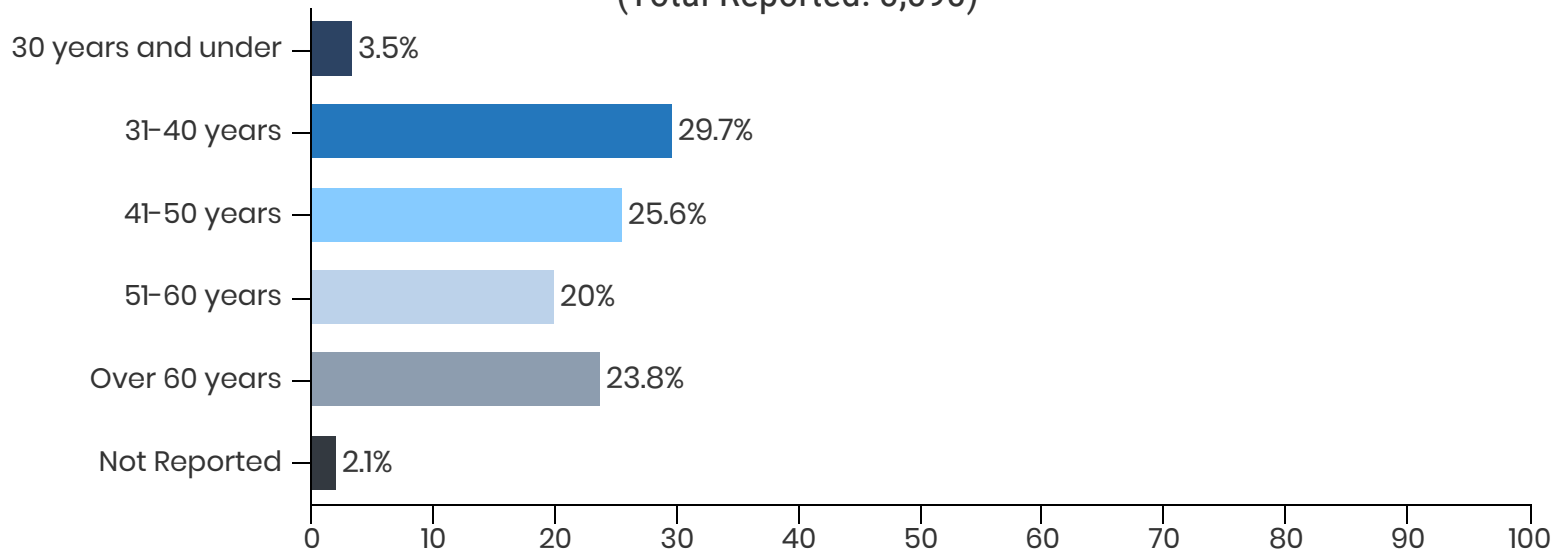

(Total Reported: 3,398)



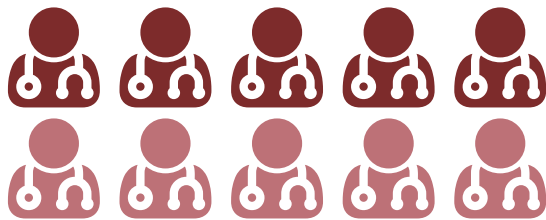
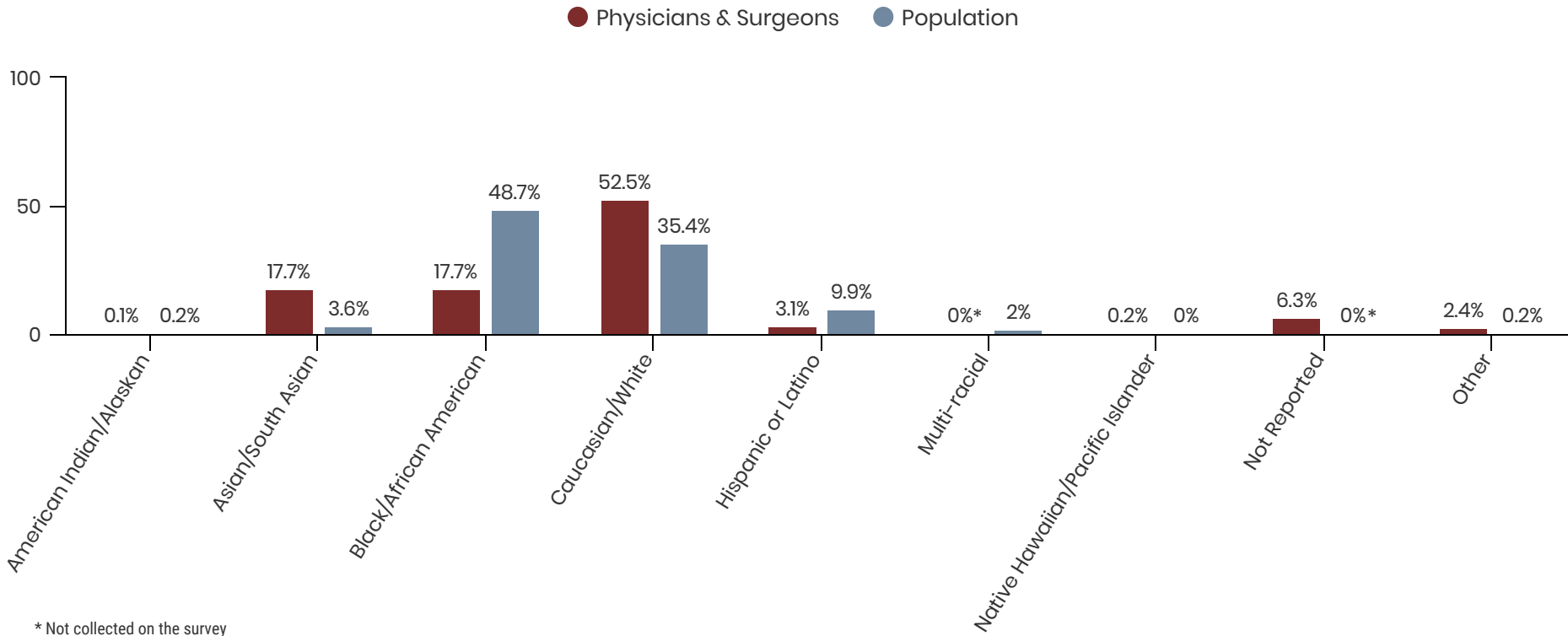

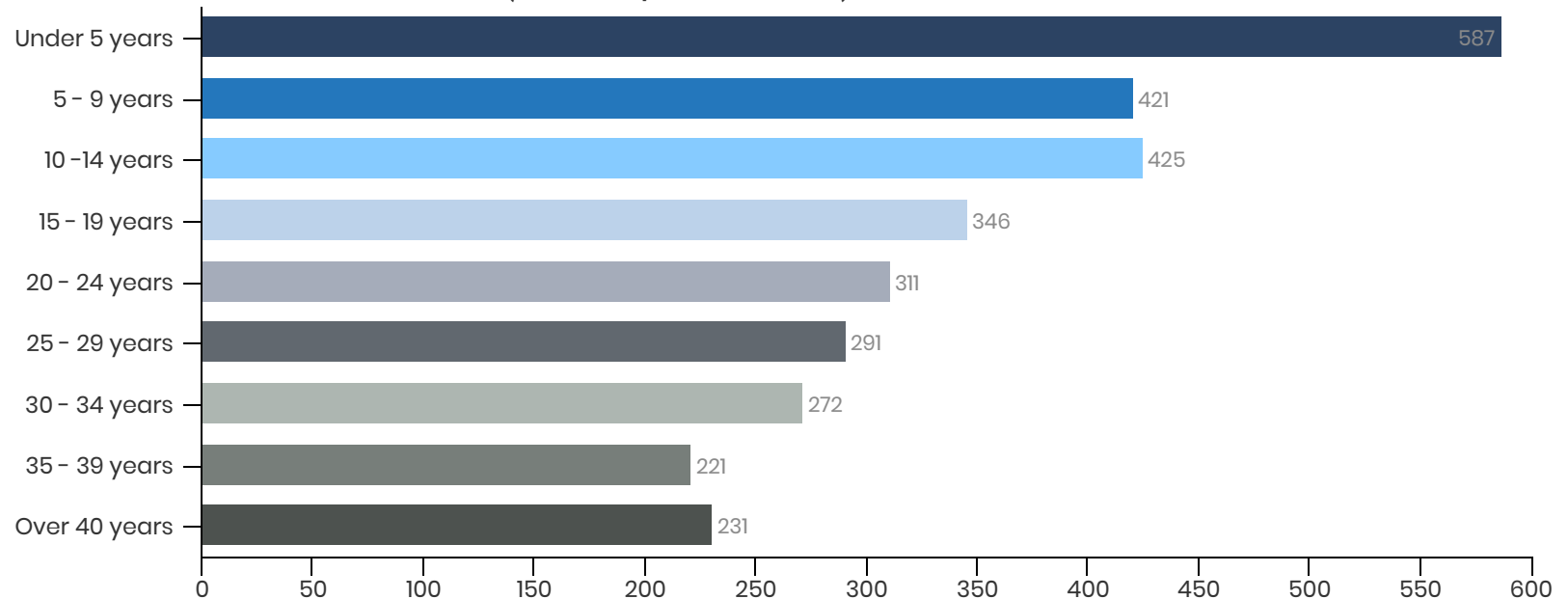

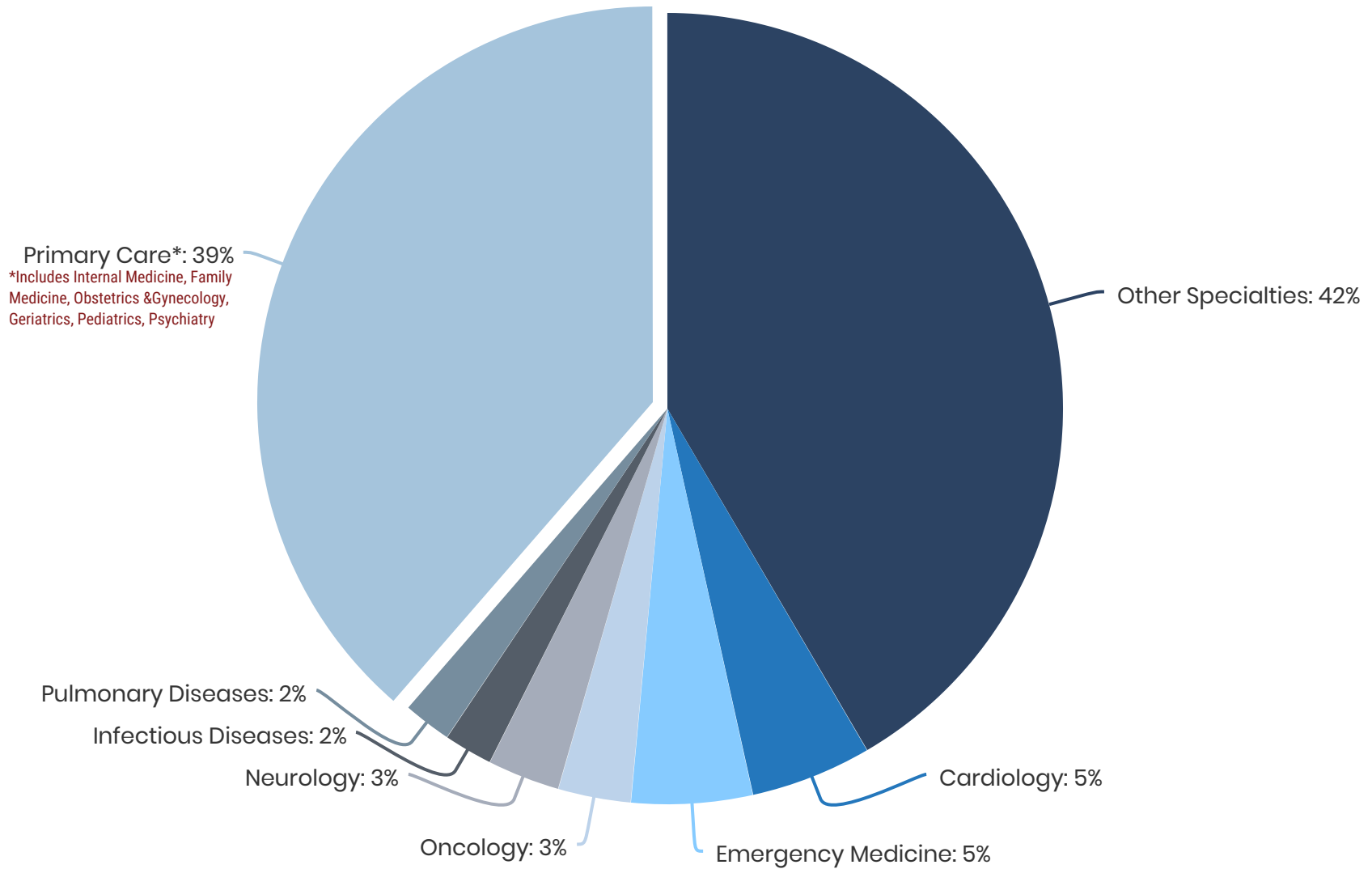

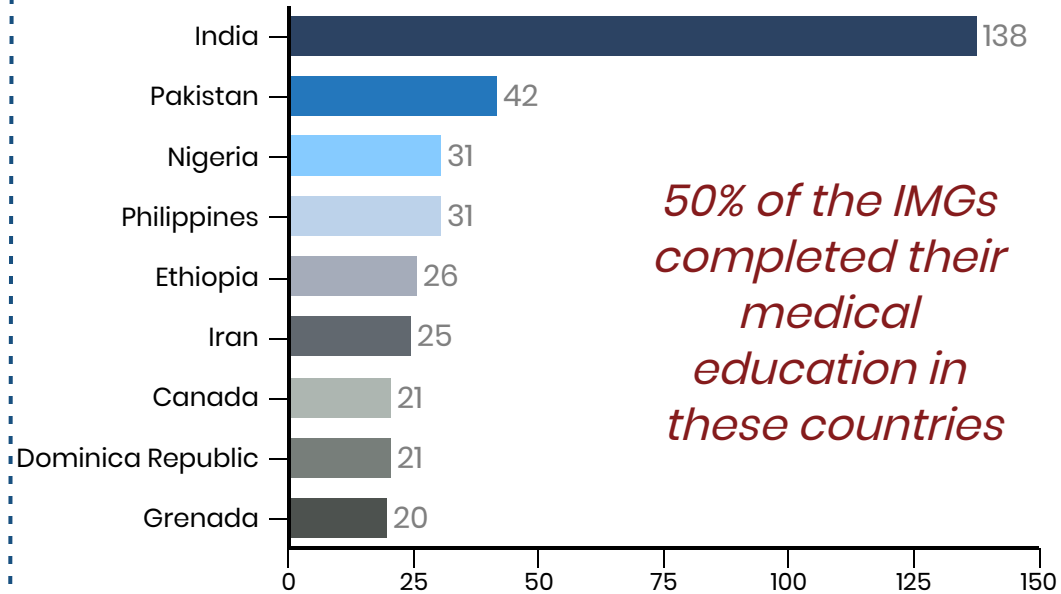

US versus International Medical Graduates (IMGs)



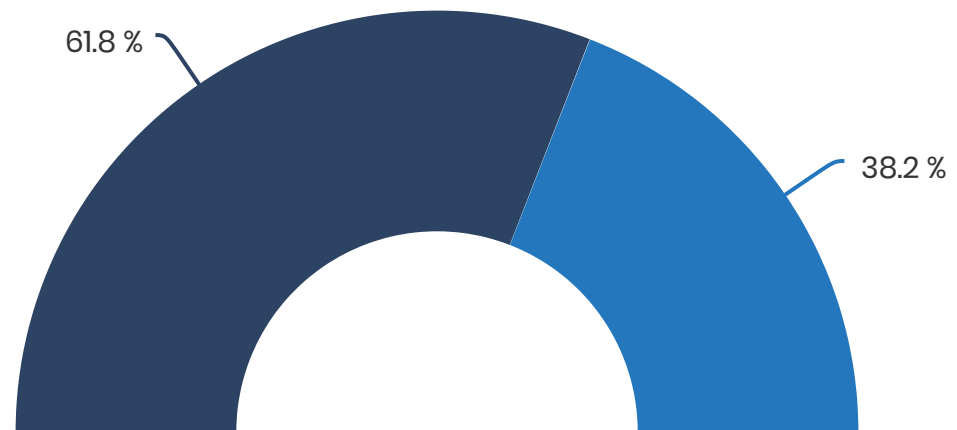
Four out of five practicing physicians graduated from a US Medical School

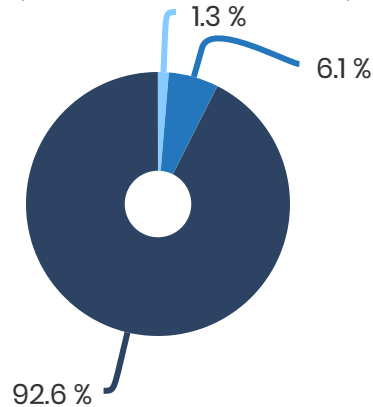

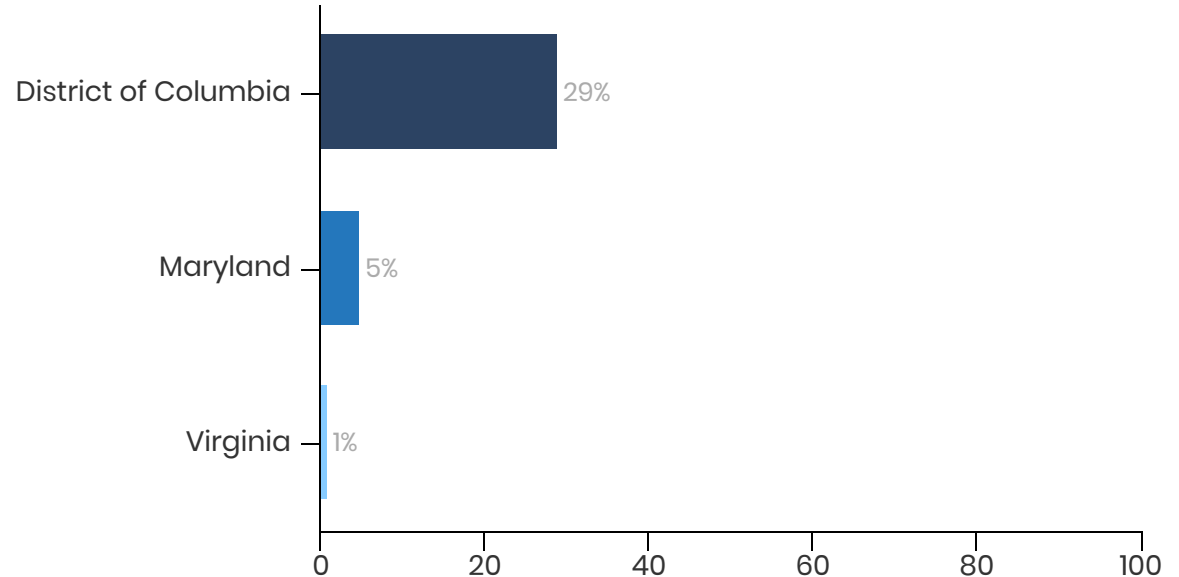

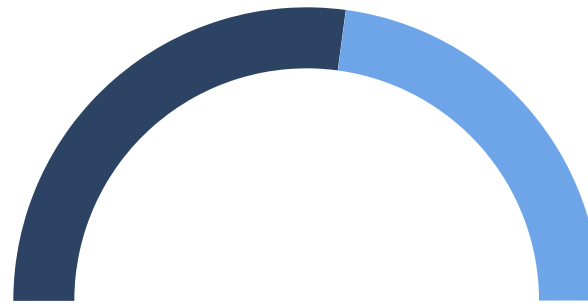

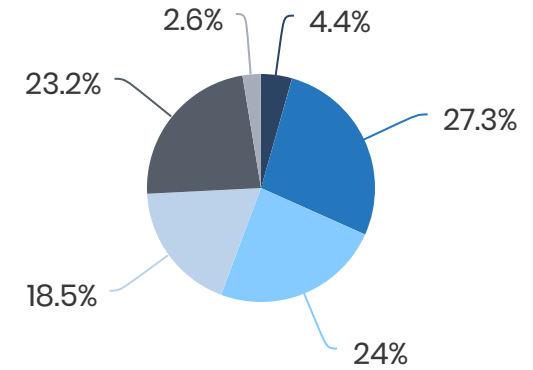

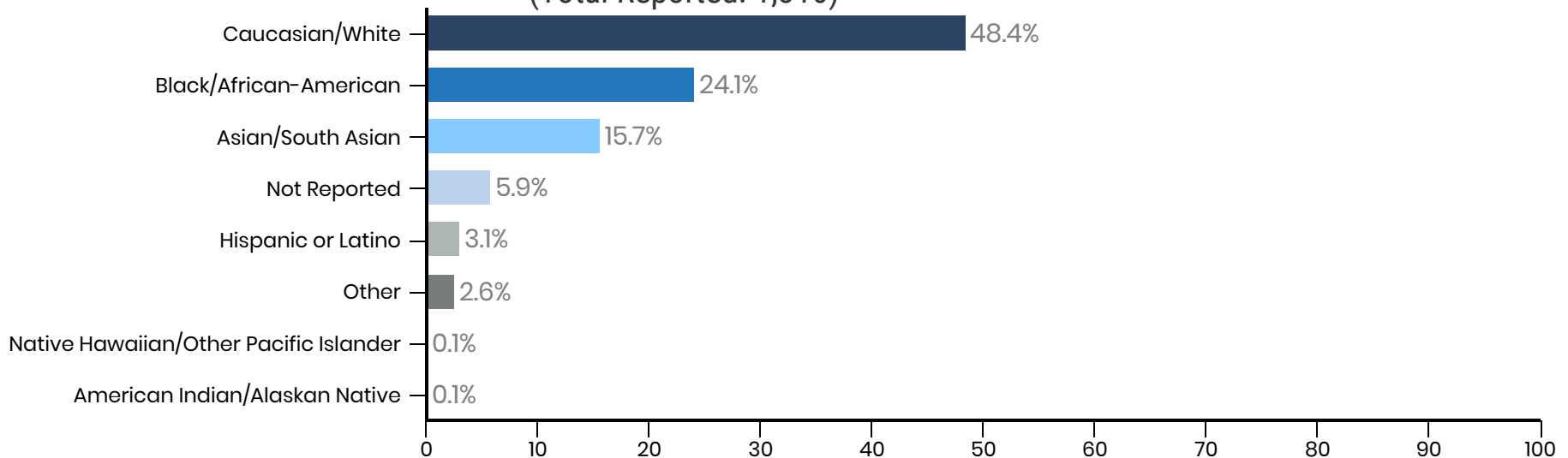

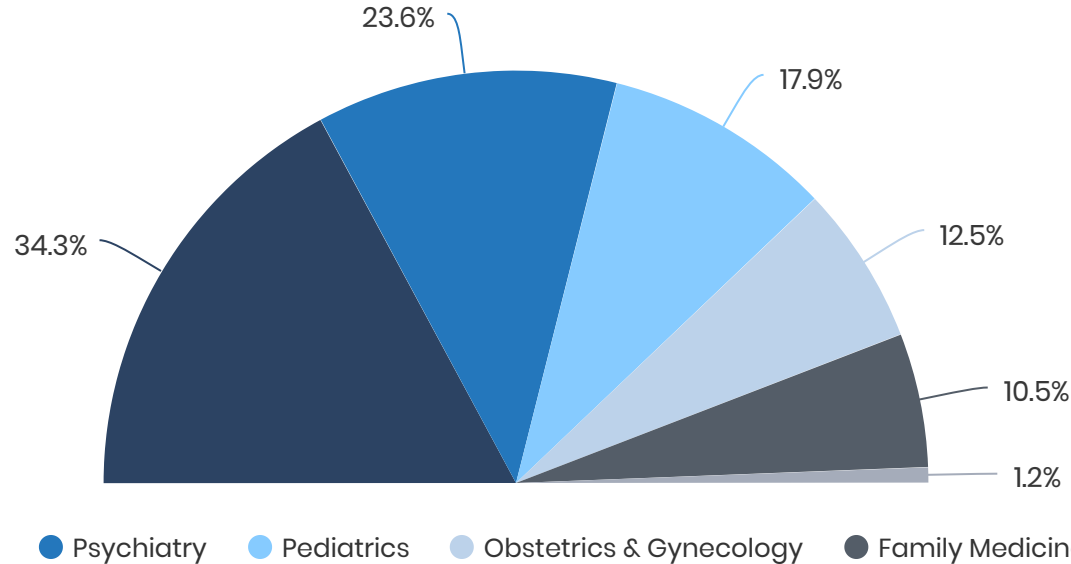

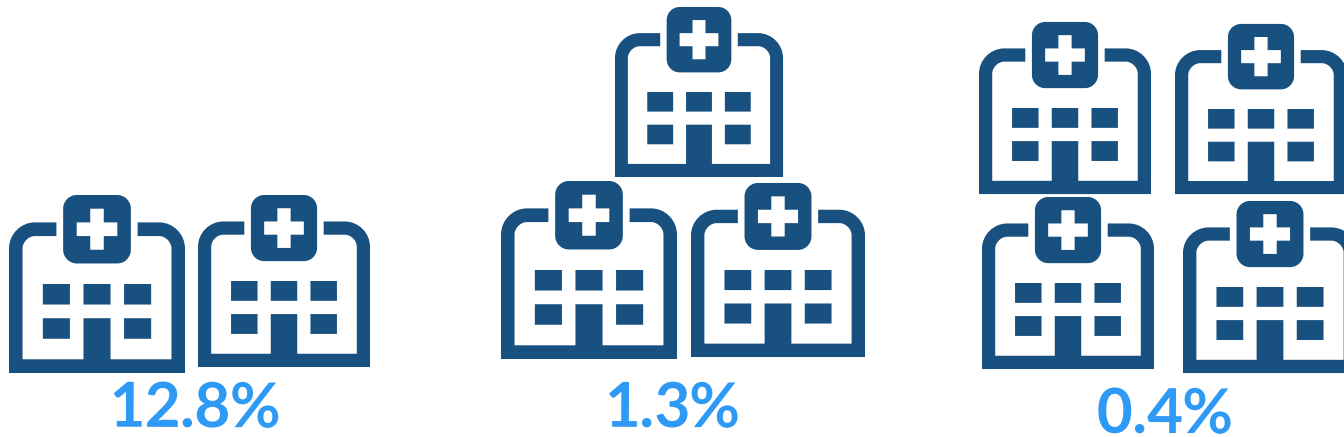
