GUIDELINES FOR ALLOWING DOGS IN OUTDOOR DINING AREAS (PATIOS) of FOOD ESTABLISHMENTS

If a retail food establishment decides to allow dogs in their outdoor dining area, they must contact the Department of Health's Division of Food (DF) at Food.Safety@dc.gov or (202)535-2180 for approval. The DF will conduct an inspection to ensure the establishment is in compliance with D.C. Law 22-91 "Dining with Dogs Act of 2018" and issue an approval document.

If your establishment has been approval to allow dogs in outdoor dining areas, you must follow these guidelines:

- Post Department-issued approval notice, which clearly states dogs are permitted in the outdoor dining area or an unenclosed sidewalk café adjacent to the food establishment.
- Provide an entrance directly from the outdoors for the dogs so that dogs never enter the indoor area of the establishment
- Provide patrons with waste bags and sanitary means of disposing of waste bags
- Ensure that all foods and beverages are prepared indoors, not on the patio
- Ensure that reusable dishes and utensils shall not be stored, displayed, or pre-set in the outdoor dining areas. Dogs may not eat off of dishes that are used for humans.
- Ensure that workers do not come in to contact with pets. If contact occurs, workers must wash their hands with soap and water
- Ensure all dogs are leashed or confined in a pet carrier at all times and that they do not occupy seats, benches, customer laps, or other furniture
- Ensure that no dogs enter the indoor area of your establishment
- Ensure that no dogs are left unattended
- Keep the outdoor dining area clean. In the event of a dog accident, the establishment must properly clean and sanitize the area.
