The AAVSB Streamlines CE Approval Process with Direct Upload to CE Broker

AAVSB is pleased to announce that it is now offering Member Boards and State Veterinary Medical Associations (VMAs) the ability to upload their statutorily approved continuing education (CE) programs into the CE Broker Board Suite. This allows Member Boards and State VMAs the autonomy to



	upload directly, streamlining the process for veterinarians and veterinary technicians to meet their mandatory CE requirements.	
OS-0418-16	LEGISLATIVE/REGULATIONS PDMP	
	 Health Occupations Revision Act (HORA) Update: DC Health worked on a significant revision of the HORA. This would be the first significant revision in seventeen years. The revised HORA received Mayoral approval and has been introduced in the Council as the <i>Health Occupations Revision General Amendment Act of 2023</i> (B25-0545). This legislation received a hearing on December 7th. Over 80 witnesses, many of whom were healthcare professionals, signed up to provide testimony. DC Health's Associate Director of Health Professional Licensing Boards provided testimony in support and answered questions from the Council. DC Health has been working on the Committee on Health following that hearing. A mark-up was held on March 21st, 2024. The legislation was passed unanimously by the Committee of the Whole on First Reading on April 2nd. It is scheduled for a Second Reading on May 7th. 	
	 DC Health Fiscal Year 2025 Budget Oversight DC Health will have its Fiscal Year 2025 Budget Oversight hearing in early April. This hearing offers an opportunity for the Committee on Health to review DC Health's proposed budget for the 2025 Fiscal Year.	
	There will be two hearings, one on April 10 th for public witnesses and one on April 11 th for representatives from DC Health.

	The new Veterinary Technician and Euthanasia Technicians regulations became effective Friday, August 6, 2021. At this time, the DC Department of Health will not be issuing registrations until the process is in place. The Department of Health is currently creating the platform by which individuals can submit an application for registration as either a Veterinary Technician or a Veterinary Euthanasia Technician. Once the platform is available, there will be a grace period for which individuals will need to come into full compliance.
